#### ORDINANCE NO. AO 2005-11

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,930,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PROVIDE LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS REQUIRED FOR FEDERAL GRANTS AND TO PAY THE COSTS OF AREAWIDE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAY ASSOCIATED OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COSTS AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 5, 2005.

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage, Alaska ("Municipality") to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,930,000) for the purpose of providing local matching funds required for federal grants that will pay the costs of areawide public transportation upgrades and related capital improvements within the Municipality.

Section 2. The sum of not to exceed One Million Nine Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$1,930,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality of Anchorage for the aforesaid public transportation and related capital improvements, including safety improvements, and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the

Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due.

Section 3. An election is to be held on April 5, 2005, in and for the Municipality of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive an "areawide" majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

### PROPOSITION NO.

#### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION BONDS**

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$1,930,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to provide the required local match to secure Federal grants of approximately \$7,720,000 from the Federal Transit Administration and Federal Highway Administration and to pay costs of public transportation upgrades and related public transportation improvements within Anchorage and, increase the municipal tax cap by an annual amount not to exceed \$141,200 to pay associated annual operations and maintenance costs?

Voter approval of this bond proposition authorizes for each \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value (based on the estimated 2005 assessed valuation areawide in Anchorage): (i) an annual increase in taxes of approximately \$0.68 to retire the proposed bonds, and (ii) an annual increase necessary to fund the proposed increase in the municipal tax cap (Charter 14.03(b)(2)) of approximately \$0.61 to pay for annual operations and maintenance costs related to the proposed capital improvements.

The debt will be paid from real and personal property taxes levied and collected areawide in Anchorage. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the debt.

5	Section 5. Section 2 of this Ordinance shall become effective only if the proposition						
6	described in Section 3 is approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the						
7	proposition at the general election on April 5, 2005. The remaining sections of this						
8	Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and approval.
