AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING CHAPTER 9.38, RELATING TO LICENSING OF BICYCLES, TO PROVIDE FOR THE TRANSFER OF BICYCLE LICENSING FROM THE ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT, TO ESTABLISH A MAXIMUM LICENSING FEE, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF A BICYCLE REGISTRATION PROGRAM BY THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT FOR REVIEW AND APPROVAL BY THE ASSEMBLY.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: That Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 9.38, sections 110–190, licensing of bicycles, is hereby amended to read as follows:

9.38.110 Registration [LICENSE] required.

No person who resides within the municipality may ride or propel a bicycle on any street, or upon any public path set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles, unless such bicycle has been <u>registered</u> [LICENSED AND A LICENSE PLATE IS ATTACHED THERETO] as provided in this chapter <u>or has a valid current registration from another jurisdiction or an approved national registry</u>.

(CAC 9.38.110; AO No. 78-72; AO No. 80-4)

9.38.120 Application for <u>registration</u> [LICENSE].

Registration [APPLICATION] for a bicycle decal or tag [LICENSE AND LICENSE PLATE] shall be made upon a form provided by the municipality and shall be made to the Director of Parks & Recreation or designee [CHIEF OF POLICE]. Registration may also be accomplished through a legitimate national bicycle registry database approved by the Anchorage Police Department. A maximum registration [LICENSE] fee of no greater than \$10.00 [\$1.00] shall be paid to the municipality before a municipal registration decal [THE LICENSE] is issued [GRANTED].

(CAC 9.38.120; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.130 Issuance of registration decal [LICENSE].

- A. The <u>Director of Parks & Recreation or designee</u> [CHIEF OF POLICE], upon receiving proper application, including make, model, color, serial number, owner name and address, shall [THEREFOR, IS AUTHORIZED TO] issue a <u>serially numbered decal or tag that shall be affixed to the bicycle frame so that it is plainly visible</u> [BICYCLE LICENSE].
- B. The <u>Director of Parks & Recreation or designee</u> [CHIEF OF POLICE] shall not issue a <u>registration decal or tag</u> [LICENSE] for any bicycle when <u>there is</u> [HE KNOWS OR HAS] reasonable ground to believe that the applicant is not the owner of or entitled to the possession of such bicycle.
- C. The <u>Director of Parks & Recreation or designee</u> [CHIEF OF POLICE] shall keep a record of the number of each <u>decal or tag</u> [LICENSE], the date issued, the name and address of the person to whom issued, [AND] the number on the frame of the bicycle for which issued, and a record of all bicycle fees collected [BY HIM].

(CAC 9.38.130; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.140 Attachment of registration tag [LICENSE PLATE].

- A. Upon registration of a bicycle by the municipality or a national registry, the owner shall affix the registration tag to the bicycle frame so that it is plainly visible. [THE CHIEF OF POLICE, UPON ISSUING A BICYCLE LICENSE, SHALL ALSO ISSUE A LICENSE PLATE BEARING THE LICENSE NUMBER ASSIGNED TO THE BICYCLE AND THE NAME OF THE MUNICIPALITY.]
- B. In case of theft or loss of decal or tag, a new one shall be obtained from the Director of Department of Parks & Recreation or from the national registry. [THE CHIEF OF POLICE SHALL CAUSE SUCH LICENSE PLATE TO BE FIRMLY ATTACHED TO THE FRAME OF THE BICYCLE FOR WHICH ISSUED IN SUCH POSITION AS TO BE PLAINLY VISIBLE.]
- C. No person may remove a <u>registration tag or decal</u> [LICENSE PLATE] from a bicycle for which issued.

(CAC 9.38.140; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.150 [INSPECTION PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF LICENSE.]

[THE CHIEF OF POLICE, OR AN OFFICER ASSIGNED SUCH RESPONSIBILITY, SHALL INSPECT EACH BICYCLE BEFORE LICENSING THE BICYCLE AND SHALL REFUSE A LICENSE FOR ANY BICYCLE WHICH HE DETERMINES IS IN UNSAFE MECHANICAL CONDITION.]

(CAC 9.38.150; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.160 Re-registration on transfer of ownership or change of address.

- A. Upon the sale or other transfer of a <u>registered</u> [LICENSED] bicycle, the <u>new owner</u> [TRANSFEREE] shall, <u>as soon as practicable</u> [WITHIN TEN DAYS OF THE DATE OF TRANSFER], register the bicycle in the <u>new owner's name</u> [NAME OF THE TRANSFEREE]. The <u>municipal registration shall indicate from whom the bicycle was acquired and the transfer fee shall not exceed \$10.00 [\$1.00].</u>
- B. As soon as practicable upon change of address, the bicycle owner shall notify the appropriate registrar.

(CAC 9.38.160; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.170 Applicability of requirements to rented bicycles.

A rental agency may not rent or offer any bicycle for rent unless the bicycle is registered [LICENSED] and a decal or tag [LICENSE PLATE] is attached thereto as provided in this chapter and such bicycle is in safe mechanical condition and properly equipped as [WITH THE LAMPS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT] required by this chapter.

(CAC 9.38.170; AO No. 78-72)

9.38.190 Alteration or mutilation of serial number or registration.

It is unlawful for any person to willfully or maliciously remove, destroy, mutilate or alter the number of any bicycle frame registered [LICENSED] pursuant to this chapter [SECTION]. It is also unlawful for any person to remove, destroy, mutilate or alter any [LICENSE PLATE, SEAL OR] registration decal or tag [CARD] during the time in which such registration is effective [LICENSE PLATE, SEAL OR REGISTRATION CARD IS OPERATIVE, PROVIDED, HOWEVER,

THAT] N[n]othing in this section shall prohibit the Department of Parks & Recreation or police department from stamping numbers on the frames of bicycles on which no serial number can be found, or on which the number is illegible or insufficient for identification purposes. (CAC 9.38.190; AO No. 78-72) Section 2: That the Parks & Recreation Department shall develop a program concerning registration and licensing which shall include provisions whereby retailer merchants who sell bicycles shall be able to register bicycles at the time of purchase. This program shall be presented to the Assembly for passage and approval no later than 180 days after passage and approval of this ordinance. That this ordinance, or any amended or substitute ordinance which Section 3: shall be presented in conjunction with the bicycle registration program approved under the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance, shall take effect 60 days from the date of passage and approval of a Parks & Recreation Bicycle Registration Program. PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

There will be some costs associated with development of a bicycle registration program including production and distribution of forms and decals as well as maintenance of a registration database. The Anchorage Police Department estimated the total cost to set up a web-enabled bike registry linking to a national registry at \$8,000. The cost to set up an MOA-maintained system is estimated to be as high as \$70,000. The registration program will also produce some revenue but that figure will be dependent on the number of bikes registered and the type of registry (national or local) chosen.

PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

With an estimated 14,000 bicycles sold in the Municipality of Anchorage each year, a \$10 registration fee would amount to a total a cost of \$140,000.
