The general duties shall consist of providing legal advice to the Assembly, drafting ordinances, resolutions and memoranda and other working documents, conducting legal research and providing opinions to the Assembly and assisting the Municipal Clerk as directed by the Presiding Officer of the Assembly.

Deputy Municipal Clerk(s) shall be confirmed by the Assembly.

B. Duties and Responsibilities:

To provide administrative and logistical support to the Assembly and to its individual Members, the Municipal Clerk shall assign the duties and responsibilities set forth below, as appropriate, in consultation with the Presiding Officer, to staff members within the four (4) divisions described above to best accomplish the tasks assigned.

From: 1 Assembly Chair Fairclough and Assembly Vice-Chair Coffey 2 3 Subject: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING CHAPTER 2.80, PERTAINING TO THE ASSEMBLY BUDGET AND 4 LEGISLATIVE SERVICES OFFICE, AND ENACTING A NEW SECTION 2.20.055, 5 6 PERTAINING TO THE MUNICIPAL CLERK'S OFFICE. 7 This ordinance is the first step in the reorganization process which began with the Assembly's work 8 session last spring. Once passed, this ordinance will result in at least two (2) fewer positions in the 9 Assembly Department. Further, the Assembly Department will be under the direction and control of the 10 Municipal Clerk, the most common, most cost effective and most appropriate method of organization in 11 local government. This reorganization saves money, reduces duplication of effort and increases 12 13 efficiency in the Department. 14 15 This ordinance also makes it clear the staff of Assembly Department and the Municipal Clerk's office serves all of Anchorage's citizens in a nonpartisan manner. The ordinance clearly and unequivocally 16 prohibits any employee from be engaged in any local municipal campaigns. This provision is intended 17 to help insure a nonpartisan Assembly. 18 19 Finally, as the Assembly resolves occupancy issues with the Administration and decides the question of 20 having an Assembly Attorney or contracting for an Assembly Attorney with the Department of Law, 21 other cost savings in the Assembly Department are likely. 22 23 24 The estimated savings from this reorganization range from \$150,000.00 to \$200,000.00 per year. 25 26 27 Prepared and submitted by: 28 29 30 31 Dan Coffey, 32 Assembly Vice-Chair 33
