 - (s) A municipality may by ordinance designate an area within its boundaries as an eligible area for purposes of this subsection and exempt from taxation an amount not to exceed \$10,000 of the assessed value of real property within the area that is owned and occupied as a permanent place of abode by a law enforcement officer. The ordinance must include a definition of "law enforcement officer." A municipality that adopts an ordinance under this subsection may not request state funds to cover any municipal budget shortfall caused by the ordinance. In this subsection, "eligible area" means an area
 - (1) that meets the eligibility requirements under a federal program of special assistance for urban development, neighborhood revitalization, or law
