A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING

TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) FROM THE HERITAGE LAND BANK FUND (221) TO THE HERITAGE LAND BANK CAPITAL FUND (421), TO BE EXPENDED AS A CONTRIBUTION TO THE GREAT LAND TRUST FOR

ACQUISITION OF THE FISH CREEK ESTUARY

In 2002, a Cooperative Agreement between the Alaska Department of Fish and Game and The Great Land Trust was signed to protect through acquisition the estuarine and adjacent wetlands of the Fish Creek estuary more particularly described as Tract A-1, Turnagain Heights Subdivision (see map, Appendix A).

As a result of the agreement, Great Land Trust was able to secure \$650,000 from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's National Coastal Wetlands Conservation program on behalf of the Fish Creek Estuary Protection Project. In return, the Municipality of Anchorage pledged \$10,000 to The Great Land Trust as part of the matching requirement for the project (Appendix B).

The project resulted in the acquisition and permanent protection of approximately 32 acres of estuarine and buffering riparian upland habitat in Anchorage to the Parks and Recreation Department of the Municipality of Anchorage as Greenbelt and Open Space Acquisition.

The acquisition of the subject property fulfills the vision of the Heritage Land Bank and the Municipality of Anchorage by providing future generations with public open space and greenbelt space primarily along the Coastal Trail, and revenue in the Heritage Land Bank fund may be appropriated by the Mayor and the Anchorage Assembly to the HLB Capital Fund only for the acquisition of land for municipal use, per AMC 25.40.035.C.

On June 9, 2005, the Heritage Land Bank Advisory Commission approved the transfer of \$10,000 from the HLB Fund (221) to its Capital Fund (421) to be expended on behalf of the Municipality of Anchorage to Great Land Trust as a contribution towards acquisition of this land (Appendix C).


Sufficient funds are available in the HLB General Fund (221) to cover this appropriation.



Dear Mr. Rue:

I am writing this letter in support of the National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Crant proposal to conserve the Fish Creek Estuary. As Director of the Anchorage Department of Cultural and Recreational Services, I recognize the significance of the Estuary to the community of Anchorage and support this collaborative effort to protect it.

The Municipality worked with Great Land Trust, resource agencies and community groups to identify Fish Creek for permanent protection. Regional and municipal coastal management plans and municipal park plans highlight its importance for wildlife and people and prioritize it for conservation. The Estuary provides a valuable wildlife corridor and habitat buffer for diverse species of fish, birds and large mammals. Located along the popular Coastal Trail, Fish Creek is a natural oasis in an urban environment enjoyed by a diverse population of citizens. This project will provide direct educational benefits by educating Anchorage residents about wetlands and estuaries through targeted outreach, public presentations and site-specific interpretative signage. The public will benefit from maintaining Fish Creek's natural character, scenic viewshed and recreational opportunities along the trail.

Funding from the National Coastal Wetlands Grant Program would enable to project partners to:

- Protect the last undeveloped estuary out of the original seven salmon streams in the Anchorage Bowl;
- Foster and build private-public partnerships to meet land conservation goals;
- Protect and expand environmental education, recreation, and wildlife viewing opportunities available to Anchorage residents and visitors; and
- · Enhance existing public park resources by expanding protected areas for wildlife.

The Municipality of Anchorage will contribute \$10,000 towards the acquisition costs and \$5000 of in-kind support including title and Phase I hazard review. The Municipality will hold title to this land in fee simple and manage it as a natural area with a conservation easement held by the Great Land Trust.

Thank you for your efforts to further this important conservation project. I look forward to working with our project partners to conserve Fish Creek Estuary.
