In 1993 the Municipality acquired two parcels of land totaling approximately 7.7 acres in area adjoining Baxter Bog Park.


In 1994 the Municipality received an approximately six-acre tract of land as a donation from Evan Rowland and Robert Kuczek to be added to adjoining Baxter Bog Park. The donation was subject to certain platting action completed by the donors in 1999.

Baxter Bog Park is a popular open space area known for its wildlife and natural character. Most of the existing park area was acquired in the 1970s and dedicated in 1984.


The Parks and Recreation Commission, at its meeting March 10, 2005, recommended that the above-described park areas be formally dedicated as part of Baxter Bog Park.


