7 THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

9 **Section 1.** The purpose of this ordinance is to increase the number of active members on the Senior
10 Citizens Advisory Commission.

12 **Section 2.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 4.60.110 is hereby amended to read as follows (*other*
13 *parts of this section are not affected and therefore not set out*):

15 **4.60.110** **Senior citizens advisory commission.**

17 There is established a senior citizens advisory commission consisting of 15 [11] members, each of
18 whom shall serve for a three-year term.

Dear Mayor Begich

The Municipal Senior Citizens Advisory Commission (SCAC) has unanimously approved a motion to request the expansion of the Commission from eleven members to fifteen members. The SCAC has renewed its commitment to the quality of life for all persons in our community, not just our senior citizens. We know that a healthy prosperous Anchorage is in the best interest of all.

The Commission is anticipating several opportunities arising from our rapidly changing world, with its increasing needs and decreasing services, cultural changes and expanding technologies with decreased access to those technologies. Many of these challenges relate to access, health care, transportation, affordable housing and recreation.

More importantly, we believe that the time is right to revisit the issue of the Municipality of Anchorage having its own local Area Agency on Aging. The concentration of population here, more than half of the state's residents and more than half of the state's senior citizens, makes a more local system of resource distribution a practical necessity. To investigate this issue anew, we believe that it would be of real assistance to have an expanded commission, plus ad hoc community members with essential areas of expertise.
