THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

**Section 1.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 14.60.030 is hereby amended by adding the following to the fine schedule: *(the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out)*

**14.60.030      Fine schedule.**

The fine schedule under this chapter is as follows:

**24.20.030      Failure to have valid permit \$50.00 to \$300.00 per day, plus double permit fees**

**Section 2.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 21.10.020 is hereby amended to read as follows: *(the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out)*

**21.10.020      Platting board.**

A. There shall be a platting board, which shall have the following powers and duties:

6.[7.] Authorize extensions of subdivision agreements as provided in section 21.87.020.

7. Hear and decide appeals under subsection 21.15.150I.

11                   **14.** The issuance of a building permit may also be subject to the improvement

14 **Section 4.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 21.15.050 is hereby amended to read as  
15 follows: *(the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out)*

17                   **21.15.050 Land use permit.**  
18

19                   A. *Permit required for certain activities.* In the area of the municipality that is  
20                   not subject to the currently adopted code under section 23.05.030, no person  
21                   may:  
22

- 23                   1. Construct a building whose floor area is 100 square feet or greater;  
24                   2. Excavate more than 300 cubic feet on any lot or tract;  
25                   3. Fill or grade more than 900 cubic feet on any lot or tract; or  
26                   4. Change the principal use of a building;

27  
28                   without obtaining a land use permit therefor in accordance with this section.  
29                   The issuance of a land use permit may also be subject to the improvement  
30                   requirements in section 21.15.150.  
31

32                   (GAAB 21.05.080; AO No. 81-97; AO No. 85-23)

34 **Section 5.** Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 21.15 is hereby amended by adding a  
35 new section to read as follows:  
36

37                   **21.15.150 Improvements associated with building or land use permits.**  
38

39                   A. *Improvements required.* The issuance of a building permit under Title 23 or  
40                   a land use permit under Title 21 for the construction of a commercial or  
41                   industrial structure on a lot, or for a residential structure on a lot, shall be  
42                   subject to the permit applicant providing the **public use easements**  
43                   **[DEDICATIONS]** and improvements required for a subdivision in the  
44                   same improvement area under chapters 21.80 and 21.85. In applying the  
45                   provisions of chapters 21.80 and 21.85 under this section, the term "lot"

1 shall be substituted for the term "subdivision," the term "permit applicant"  
2 shall be substituted for the term "subdivider," and the term "Municipal  
3 Engineer" shall be substituted for the term "platting authority."  
4

5 B. *Exceptions.* The requirements in subsection A of this section shall not  
6 apply to a building permit or land use permit to the extent that:  
7

8 1. **All construction associated with a single dwelling unit located on**  
9 **a single lot, tract, or parcel, regardless of zoning district**[**THE**  
10 **PERMIT HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE MUNICIPALITY**  
11 **PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2003]; or**

12  
13 2. the Traffic Engineer determines that a street dedications or  
14 improvement are not required for traffic circulation; or

15  
16 3. dedications, public use easements, or improvements already have  
17 been provided to the applicable standard in chapters 21.80 or 21.85;  
18 or  
19

20 4. the dedications, public use easement, or improvements will be  
21 provided under a subdivision agreement that has been entered in to  
22 under chapter 21.87, or under an established assessment district; or  
23

24 5. the municipality has already appropriated funds to construct an  
25 improvement;[.] or  
26

27 6. **the permit is for repairs, maintenance, emergencies, electrical,**  
28 **mechanical, or plumbing.**  
29

30 C. *Standards for requiring public use easements [DEDICATIONS] and*  
31 *improvements.* Where chapters 21.80 or 21.85 grant discretion to determine  
32 whether a public use easement [DEDICATION] or improvement will be  
33 required, or to determine the design standards for a dedication or  
34 improvement, the Municipal Engineer shall determine the requirement or  
35 standard that applies to a building permit or land use permit under this  
36 section by applying the following standards:  
37

38 1. The public use easement [DEDICATION] or improvement shall  
39 be reasonably related to the anticipated impacts on public facilities  
40 and adjacent areas that will result from the use and occupancy of the  
41 structure that is the subject of the building or land use permit. **Any**  
42 **required public use easement area shall not be used for the**  
43 **purpose of density calculation of lot coverage per the applicable**  
44 **zoning district.** The Municipal Engineer may require the permit  
45 applicant to provide information or analyses to determine impacts **as**

1 set out in the Anchorage 2020 Plan's policies for transportation,  
2 transportation design and maintenance, and water resources on  
3 public facilities and adjacent areas, including without limitation the  
4 following:

- 5
- 6 a. A traffic impact analysis, or similar information. The Traffic  
7 Engineer may require a traffic impact analysis if the same  
8 would be required for approval of a subdivision, conditional  
9 use or site plan for similar development under this title.
- 10
- 11 b. A drainage study, or similar information. A drainage study  
12 may be required if the same would be required for approval  
13 of a subdivision, conditional use or site plan for similar  
14 development under this title.
- 15
- 16 c. An estimate of the financial **[AND SOCIAL]** costs of  
17 impacts on public facilities and adjacent areas without the  
18 required improvements, including without limitation,  
19 **[VISUAL]** continuity of improvements, maintenance costs  
20 of public facilities, parking, drainage, noise and dust control,  
21 pedestrian and vehicle safety and access, and emergency  
22 vehicle access and response time.
- 23
- 24 d. Information concerning the consistency of the impacts of the  
25 proposed development with the comprehensive plan.
- 26
- 27 e. A design of internal streets and location of fire hydrants  
28 satisfactory to the Fire Marshal for purposes of fire  
29 protection within the development.
- 30
- 31 2. The estimated cost of constructing the improvement shall be  
32 reasonable when compared to the estimated cost of the proposed  
33 development under the building or land use permit. The  
34 determination of reasonableness shall be based on cost estimates for  
35 the improvement and the proposed development that the permit  
36 applicant or applicant's agent submits under penalty of perjury. If  
37 the Municipal Engineer determines that the estimated cost to the  
38 applicant to complete all the improvements required by this section  
39 is unreasonable in relation to the estimated cost of the proposed  
40 development, the Municipal Engineer may reduce or eliminate  
41 required improvements as necessary to make the relationship  
42 between such costs reasonable.
- 43
- 44 3. The Municipal Engineer shall consider the potential development of  
45 all adjacent parcels, lots or tracts under common ownership, in

1 addition to the lot, parcel or tract that is the subject of the permit  
2 application, and the impacts associated therewith, in applying the  
3 standards in this subsection.  
4

- 5 4. The Municipal Engineer may approve adjustments to the  
6 improvement requirements under this section to the extent that  
7 compliance with the standards would result in an adverse impact on  
8 natural features such as wetlands, steep slopes, or existing mature  
9 vegetation; existing development; or public safety.  
10

11 D. *Phasing of installation.* Except as provided in this section, all required  
12 improvements shall be constructed and accepted by the municipality before  
13 any certificate of occupancy (conditional or unconditional) is issued for the  
14 permitted construction. If the Municipal Engineer determines that it is not  
15 reasonable to require compliance with the preceding sentence, no permit  
16 may be issued until the applicant enters into an agreement for construction  
17 of the required improvements, with performance guaranties, in the form  
18 required for subdivision improvements under chapter 21.87.  
19

20 E. *Warranty.* All improvements required under this section shall be subject to  
21 the warranty and guarantee of warranty requirements provided for  
22 subdivision improvements in chapter 21.87  
23

24 F. *Oversizing.* If an improvement exceeding the requirements of this section is  
25 requested by the municipality and is necessary for the adequate and efficient  
26 development of surrounding areas, the municipality may require the  
27 applicant to install or accommodate oversizing. In such event the  
28 municipality shall reimburse the applicant for the cost of the oversizing at  
29 least as soon as budgeted funds are available after completion and  
30 acceptance of the improvements. This subsection shall not be a limitation  
31 on the municipality's ability to require a utility to oversize its facilities or a  
32 limitation on the manner in which the municipality may pay its  
33 proportionate share of the costs of oversizing.  
34

35 G. *Fee in lieu.* A fee in lieu of the required improvements may be accepted if  
36 the Municipal Engineer determines:  
37

- 38 1. That the improvements or construction activities associated  
39 therewith would create a potential undue safety hazard to motorists  
40 or pedestrians; or  
41  
42 2. Due to the nature of existing development on adjacent properties it  
43 is unlikely that improvements would be extended in the foreseeable  
44 future and the improvements associated with the development under  
45 review do not, by themselves, provide a sufficient improvement to

1 safety or capacity or a sufficient benefit to the property to be  
2 developed under the building or land use permit to warrant  
3 construction.

4  
5 **3. Any fee paid pursuant to this section shall be accounted for**  
6 **separately, and the fee paid shall be dedicated and used only for**  
7 **the purpose of constructing the public facilities which were**  
8 **identified by the Municipal Engineer and for which the fee was**  
9 **paid.**

10  
11 H. *Fee amount.* The amount of the fee in lieu shall be the lesser of seventy-  
12 five percent of the cost of the improvements as estimated by an engineer  
13 registered as a professional engineer in Alaska or as provided in a fee  
14 schedule adopted by regulation by the Municipal Engineer, which fee  
15 schedule may be adjusted by regulation annually to account for increases in  
16 construction costs in the Anchorage area. In the event the applicant or  
17 successor in interest later elects or is required to install improvements for  
18 which the fee was paid, the fee shall be refunded (without interest), so long  
19 as the claim for refund is filed within two years from the date of initial  
20 payment.

21  
22 I. *Appeals.* A permit applicant may appeal a decision of the Municipal  
23 Engineer concerning required improvements under this section to the  
24 platting board by filing a written notice of appeal with the secretary of the  
25 platting board not later than 10 days after receipt of written notice of the  
26 decision. The appeal shall be placed on the agenda of the next regularly  
27 scheduled platting board meeting that occurs not less than 20 days after the  
28 filing of the appeal. The platting board shall hear the appeal *de novo*.

29  
30 **Section 6.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 24.20.030 is hereby amended to read as  
31 follows:

32  
33 **24.20.030 Permit, a[A]pproval of plans required.**

34  
35 A. *Permit required.* It is unlawful for anyone to receive a building or land use  
36 permit without first having applied for and obtained a permit required by  
37 this chapter. In addition to any other remedy available at law, fines for  
38 failure to have a permit under this subsection may be assessed according to  
39 the schedule provided in Title 14.

40  
41 B. *Approval of plans required.* Plans, specifications and other data as set forth  
42 in section 24.30.030 shall be submitted to project management and  
43 engineering for approval prior to the start of any work. The plans shall  
44 clearly state that all work will be performed in accordance with municipal  
45 standards and specifications, including the applicable standards in Title 21.

Improvements will not be allowed or accepted unless the plans have been approved by the municipal engineer.

(GAAB 25.15.010)

**Section 7.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 24.20.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:

**24.20.040      Payment of fees; deposits.**

- A. A developer shall pay the municipality's actual cost associated with the work the developer performs in a public place under a development or subdivision agreement. The municipality's cost shall include but is not limited to administering the agreement, plan checking, surveillance and administrative overhead.
- B. Prior to issuance of a notice to proceed to the developer, the developer shall pay a deposit toward the municipality's costs based upon the estimated cost of the improvements to be constructed under the development or subdivision agreement, as follows:

TABLE INSET:

Estimated Cost	Deposit
\$10,000.00 or less	\$300.00
Over \$10,000.00 up to \$50,000.00	4% of estimated cost
Over \$50,000.00 up to \$150,000.00	3% of estimated cost
Over \$150,000.00 up to \$500,000.00	2.5% of estimated cost
Over \$500,000.00	\$13,000.00

The deposit shall be paid in accordance with the following schedule:

1. Upon application for the development or subdivision agreement: \$300.00.
2. Upon submission of plans for the improvements: 0.5 percent of the estimated cost of the improvements or \$150.00, whichever is greater.
3. Prior to issuance of the notice to proceed: The balance of the deposit.

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- D. Prior to acceptance of completion by the municipality of the undertaking by the developer, the developer shall also pay a deposit toward the



municipality's costs incurred during the warranty period under the development or subdivision agreement in an amount determined by the director of public works, but not exceeding \$2,000.00. This deposit may be retained from any balance remaining in the deposit paid under subsection B of this section. At the end of the warranty period, the municipality shall determine its costs during that period. If the costs exceed the deposit, the developer shall pay the balance to the municipality. If the deposit exceeds the costs, the municipality shall refund the balance to the developer.

**Section 8.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 24.20.060 is hereby repealed as follows:

**24.20.060     [APPLICABILITY OF TITLE TO ANCHORAGE TELEPHONE UTILITY.]**

[THIS TITLE SHALL APPLY TO THE ANCHORAGE TELEPHONE UTILITY.]

(AO No. 91-173(S))

**SECTION 9. ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 24.30.020 IS HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:]**

**24.30.020 Permit required; sidewalk permits and exemptions.**

A. *Permit required.* It is unlawful for anyone to use or improve any public place as defined in section 24.30.010 without first having applied for and obtained a permit to engage in such use or improvement and paying the permit fee if one is prescribed in this title. No contractor's license shall be required of a certificated utility doing its own work. Nothing contained in this section shall apply to street or storm sewer maintenance work performed by the municipality or street or storm sewer improvement projects under contract with the municipality. ~~[A PERMIT MUST BE OBTAINED FOR THE USE OF ANY PUBLIC PLACE.]~~ Fines for failure to have a permit under this subsection may be assessed according to the schedule provided in Title 14.

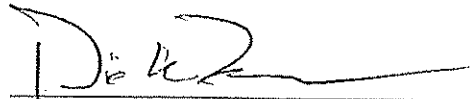

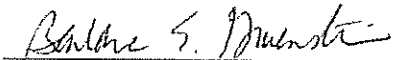

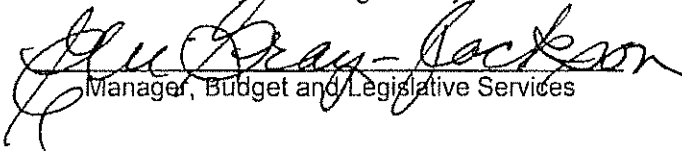
The dollar impact will depend on the particular development and is not quantifiable at this time.

Hundreds of condominiums and other projects have been constructed within the past few years without provision of the necessary infrastructure to support the developments.

In an effort to address this continuing problem, the Planning Department, in conjunction with other Municipal departments, developed this ordinance to address the public need for road improvements and dedicated rights-of-way.

This ordinance will apply to all types of development including single family, condominiums, apartments and commercial development. It gives the Municipal Engineer, the Building Official, and the Traffic Engineer the authority to make requirements for dedications and/or improvements.

The Planning Department and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommend approval.

A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING APPROVAL TO THE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDMENT TO ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLES 14, 21, 23, AND 24 TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEDICATION AND IMPROVEMENT OF PUBLIC FACILITIES WITHIN AND ADJACENT TO CERTAIN TYPES OF DEVELOPMENT.

(Case 2002-110)

WHEREAS, the Municipality has requested an ordinance amendment to amend various Municipal Code Titles to allow for the dedication and improvement of public facilities within or adjacent to certain types of development, and

WHEREAS, notices were published, and a public hearing was held on November 4, 2002 and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Municipal Planning and Zoning Commission that:

1. The Commission makes the following findings of fact:
  - a. The Municipal staff, the general public, development community and members from the Municipal Assembly have been working on the ordinance revisions for over 18 months.
  - b. The amendments will help facilitate orderly development of the community.
  - c. The amendments will help ensure that all developments will have the required public infrastructure improvements.
  - d. The Anchorage 2020 Plan places emphases on infill development and this ordinance will help facilitate orderly infill development.
  - e. This type of ordinance is used as a standard practice in other communities.
2. The Commission recommends the Municipal Assembly approve the ordinance amendments to Titles 14, 21, 23 and 24 to provide for dedication and improvements with new development.
