AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AO 2005-79, REGARDING CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW CIVIC AND CONVENTION CENTER FACILITY, TO ADJUST VACATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY ON F STREET AND G STREET.

WHEREAS, on July 26, 2005, the Assembly approved <u>AO 2005-91</u> [AO 2005-79], authorizing construction of a new civic and convention center facility on Block 80, Anchorage Original Townsite, pursuant to voter approval of a ballot proposition on April 5, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Dowl Engineers, in preparing the plat for the new civic and convention center facility on Block 80, Anchorage Original Townsite, determined the amount of right of way vacated on F & G Streets needs to be approximately 5.5 feet on G Street, rather than 4 feet as previously approved to properly align the facility; and

WHEREAS, the vacation of right of way in <u>AO 2005-91</u> [AO 2005-79], 8 feet, does not meet the requirement; now therefore

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The right of way vacated along G Street is increased from 4 feet in width to 5.5 feet in width, as shown on attached Exhibit A.

Section 2. All other provisions in AO 2005-91 [AO 2005-79] shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 3</u>. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Assembly, except as otherwise set forth in <u>AO 2005-91</u> [AO 2005-79].



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AO 2005-79, REGARDING CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW CIVIC AND CONVENTION CENTER FACILITY, TO ADJUST

VACATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY ON F STREET AND G STREET.

At the time AO 2005-91 was enacted, ACCT and the Municipality anticipated the need for the Block 80 Convention Center to extend approximately 5 feet beyond the Block 80 property lines into the right of way. Because the traffic flow, and parking plan as well as the final design of the building itself were not complete at that time. The ordinance authorized vacation of the right of way on both the G and F streets sides of up to 4 feet.

The design and traffic plan are now much closer to completion and a further vacation on the G street side is necessary to implement the finalized design and traffic plan. Specifically, in order to allow for parking on the F street side of the convention center, the building can only be constructed in .4 foot of the F street right of way. In addition because the final design has incorporated windows which protrude beyond the plane of the building the building now extends 5.9 feet beyond the current 300 feet block width. The net effect is to require a vacation of the G street right of way of 5.5 feet rather than the maximum 4 feet originally anticipated.

This ordinance authorizes an increase in the vacation of the G street right of way to a maximum of 5.5 feet. This vacation has been reviewed and considered by both the Municipal Traffic Engineer and the Municipal Engineer and both concur.
