PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

The Security Surcharge Tariff is decreased from $.40\phi$ per ton charge on all Port of Anchorage stakeholders to $.38\phi$ per ton. Annual revenue will fund 87.5% of security program to comply with Coast Guard regulations. Port revenues will fund the Port's contract share of 12.5%. One year contract with four one-year options will began July 2004 and is entering the second option phase.

SUMMARY OF ECONOMIC EFFECTS

PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

The Port of Anchorage's cost of security is allocated 12.5% to the Port and 87.5% to the stakeholders. Stakeholder contributions are via a Security Surcharge Tariff per ton based on their respective percentage of the prior year's tonnage. Resulting primarily from increase tonnage, the per ton tariff rate has DEcreased from \$0.40 per ton initiated in 2004 to \$0.38 per ton for this next contract renewal period.

2 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT #1 TO THE PORT Subject: 3 OF ANCHORAGE TERMINAL TARIFF NO. 6 TO DECREASE THE SECURITY SURCHARGE TARIFF RETROACTIVE TO AUGUST 1, 4 5 2006. 6 7 The cost and related expenses to comply with the United States Department of Homeland 8 9 Security regulations are substantially greater than the security costs historically incurred by the Port of Anchorage. To resolve the added cost, the Port Users, via the Upper Cook Inlet 10 Area Maritime Security Committee, recommended a per ton tariff to cover the majority of 11 12 the Security Contract cost and related expenses. 13 On June 22, 2004, the Assembly approved Ordinance #2004-101 establishing a Port Security 14 15 Surcharge Tariff of Forty Cents (\$0.40) per ton. The Security Surcharge Tariff is computed by allocating Twelve and One-half Percent (12.5%) of the cost first to the Port of Anchorage. 16 The remaining Eighty Seven and One-half Percentage (87.5%) is allocated to participating 17 Port Users pro-rated on their respective percentages of the previous year's total tonnage for 18 19 the combined Port Users. 20 21 The 2006/2007 security contract costs are \$1,832,898. After deduction of the Port's 12.5%, 22 the current per ton tariff rate is calculated to be \$0.38. 23

On June 26, 2006, the Port Commission for the Port of Anchorage approved a resolution decreasing the security surcharge tariff from \$.40 per ton to \$.38 per ton, effective retroactive to August 1, 2006.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO ANCHORAGE TERMINAL TARIFF NO. 6 BY DECREASING THE SECURITY SURCHARGE TARIFF FROM \$0.40 PER TON TO \$0.38 PER TON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Anchorage Municipal Code 11.50.030.C, the Anchorage Port Commission is charged with promulgating the Port's Terminal Tariff subject to approval of the Anchorage Municipal Assembly and the Federal Maritime Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security, in response to security threats poised to the Nation since September 11, 2001, enacted new security requirements for qualified marine terminals under 33 CFR 105; and,

WHEREAS, in compliance with this regulation the Upper Cook Inlet Area Maritime Security Committee, representing all the major Port users, adopted a facility security plan consistent with the requirements of 33 CFR 105; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Upper Cook Inlet Area Maritime Security Committee have recommended that the Port of Anchorage adopt a tariff amendment in order to pay for a security force necessary to meet the facility security plan; and

WHEREAS, the Port of Anchorage, acting on behalf of the Upper Cook Inlet Area Maritime Security Committee, issued a Municipality of Anchorage procurement in order to identify the actual costs of providing a security force to meet the facility security plan; and

WHEREAS, a one year contract with four one-year options was approved by the Assembly in 2004 with Doyon Universal Services, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, the contractor desires to exercise the second year option for the amount of One Million Eight Hundred Thirty-two Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$1,832,898); and

Anchorage Port Commission Resolution R04-02 May 27, 2004

WHEREAS, Twelve and One-half percent (12.5%) of the contract cost is allocated to the Port and the remaining Eighty Seven and One-half percent (87.5%) to participating stakeholders based on their respective percentage of total tonnage for the previous year (total 2005 tonnage for participating stakeholders was 4,276,215);

NOW THEREFORE, the Anchorage Port Commission resolves:

Section 1. That the Port Commission approves the following amendment to the Port of Anchorage Terminal Tariff No. 6:

Section 2. Wharfage, Item 250, paragraph "H" is amended as follows:

H. Not withstanding any other schedule of charges. The Port of Anchorage shall assess a security surcharge of \$0.38 per ton for all commodities crossing the Port of Anchorage.

Section 3. That the Port Commission and Port staff will review the Port's security surcharge tariff for appropriate modifications and adjustments by March 1st.

Section 4. This amendment shall become effective August 1, 2006.
