AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 28.60.040 AND 28.60.050 REGARDING SPECIAL NEEDS BALLOTS TO HOSPITAL PATIENTS. ALLOWING PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE ASSISTANCE TO DISABLED **VOTERS. AND REQUIRING ONE ATTESTATION ON AN ABSENTEE BALLOT** BY MAIL.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Les A0 2006-155/5-1)

Section 1. Anchorage Municipal Code section 28.60.040 is amended to read as follows:

28.60.040 <u>Special needs voting [EMERGENCY APPLICATION].</u>

Persons admitted as hospital patients and persons physically Α. prevented from voting at a polling place, may vote a special needs ballot.

B[A]. Persons admitted as hospital patients [Special needs].

- Any qualified voter who is an admitted [A] patient under the <u>1.</u> care of a physician in a hospital [OR IN A PRIVATE HOME] on the date of election and who is unable to vote in the polling place of the voter's [HIS] precinct may request delivery of a special needs ballot [TO HIM] during or after the time of application for absentee ballots has elapsed [, until Election A request for delivery of a special needs ballot Dayl. may be made either by:
 - Telephone; or <u>a.</u>
 - Self designation of a personal representative.

SUCH REQUESTS MAY BE MADE BY TELEPHONE OR BY A THIRD PARTY ON THE VOTER'S BEHALF.]

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- 2. Delivery. If in the opinion of the municipal clerk, there is sufficient time for a special needs [THE VOTED] ballot to be delivered and returned before closing of the polls, a duly appointed and sworn election official shall take the special needs ballot, along with an absentee ballot application and other necessary materials, to the voter.
 - a. After completing and signing [HAVING FILLED OUT AND HAVING SIGNED] the application for absentee ballot, the voter shall cast the special needs [HIS] ballot in the manner provided in this chapter for absentee voting [IN THE OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPAL CLERK].
 - <u>b.</u> If there is doubt of the voter's qualifications, <u>the election official may request the voter</u> [HE MAY BE REQUESTED] to comply with the questioned ballot procedure.
- 3. <u>Self-designation of a personal representative.</u> <u>See subsection D. below.</u>
- C[2]. A qualified voter, with a disability preventing the voter from physically going to a polling place to vote, may request pick-up and delivery of a special needs ballot, through a self-designated personal representative, from one of the following election officials during the periods specified:
 - a. An absentee voting official on or after the 15th day before an election, up to and including Election Day; or
 - b. An election supervisor on or after the 15th day before an election, up to and including Election Day; or
 - c. An absentee voting official at an absentee voting station designated under section 28.60.030B. on or after the 15th day before an election, up to and including Election Day; or
 - d. A member of the precinct election board on Election Day.
- D[B] Special needs voting by personal representative.

- 1. If a qualified voter requests a special needs ballot [under this section,] through a self-designated personal representative, the personal representative shall sign a register provided by an election official and include the following information:
 - <u>a.</u> The **personal** representative's name;
 - b. The personal representative's residence address and mailing address;
 - c. The personal representative's social security number, voter number, or date of birth;
 - d. The name of the voter on whose behalf the **personal** representative is requesting a ballot and voting materials;
 - <u>e.</u> An oath stating the **personal** representative:
 - i. is receiving a ballot and voting materials on behalf of the voter;
 - ii. will not vote the ballot for the voter;
 - iii. will not coerce the voter;
 - iv. will not divulge the vote cast by the voter; and
 - v. has been notified that unlawful interference with voting is punishable under AS 15.56.030;
 - <u>f.</u> The personal representative's signature.

2. Delivery.

- a. The personal representative shall deliver the special needs ballot and other voting materials to the voter as soon as practicable.
- b. The voter shall mark the ballot in secret, place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve, and place the secrecy sleeve in the envelope provided.
- c. The voter shall provide the information on the envelope same as required for voting in person by absentee ballot.

- d. The voter shall sign the voter certificate in the presence of the personal representative.
- <u>e.</u> <u>The **personal** representative shall sign as attesting official and date the voter's signature.</u>
- 3. The personal representative shall deliver the ballot and voter certificate to an election official as specified in subsection C. above, [9.28.060B.1.] no later than 8:00 p.m. Alaska time on Election Day.
- 4. If a qualified voter's disability precludes the voter from performing any of the requirements of subsection D[B].2., the personal representative may perform those requirements, except making the voting decision on the voter's behalf.
- <u>A person shall not act as a **personal** representative for a voter if:</u>
 - a. The person is the employer of the voter; or
 - b. An agent of the employer of the voter; or
 - <u>c.</u> An officer or agent of the union of the voter; or
 - d. A candidate for office in the election.

<u>Section 2</u>. Anchorage Municipal Code section 28.60.050 is amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

28.60.050 Voting absentee by mail.

D. Attestation.

Upon receipt of an absentee ballot by mail, the voter, in the presence of a notary public, commissioned officer of the armed forces including the National Guard, district judge or magistrate, the designated United States postal official, or other person qualified to administer oaths, shall mark the ballot in secret, place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve, if provided, place the ballot in an envelope, and sign the voter's certificate on the back of the envelope in the presence of an

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official listed in this subsection, who shall sign as attesting official and shall date the signature.


If none of the officials listed in this subsection are reasonably accessible, an absentee voter shall also certify under penalty of perjury that no official empowered to administer oaths is available, as prescribed in AS 09.63.020. In addition, the voter shall sign the voter certificate in the presence of an individual [HAVE THE VOTER'S CERTIFICATE ATTESTED BY TWO PERSONS OVER THE AGE OF] 18 years of age or older, who shall sign as a witness and attest to the date the voter signed the voter certificate in the presence of the witness.

BY MAIL.

The attached ordinance AO No. 2006-155(S) would allow the Municipal Clerk to deliver ballots to admitted hospital patients, allow disabled voters to vote with the assistance of a personal representative and require only one witness on an absentee ballot envelope, as before.

The S version changes have been made to take the opportunity to more appropriately rename this section of code; clarify the language distinguishing the two available categories of Special Needs ballots; and offer a separate section identifying the duties of the self-designated, personal representative.
