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WHEREAS, the passage of House Bill 13 provides the District with an opportunity to reinstate positions, make critical changes which enhance student instructional programs, safety and compliance issues of Title IX, address building-level life and safety projects; and

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WHEREAS, the Anchorage School Board approved on May 22, 2006 the revision to the FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan; and

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WHEREAS, the Anchorage School District's General Fund is being increased by \$6,516,471 to provide for needed improvements for the children of Anchorage; and

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NOW THEREFORE, The Anchorage Assembly resolves:

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SUBJECT: ANCHORAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT REVISED FINANCIAL PLAN

- FY 2006-2007

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The Anchorage School District's FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan, as adopted by the Anchorage Assembly on March 28, 2006, per Assembly Ordinance 2006-37(S), provided a spending authority level of \$608,226,391. This included \$466,916,176 for the General Fund, \$15,000,000 for the Food Service Fund, \$77,310,215 for the Debt Service Fund, and \$49,000,000 for the Local, State, and Federal Grants Fund.

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On May 22, 2006 the School Board approved a revision to the School District's FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan as set forth in the Assembly Resolution 2006-37(S) and School Board Memorandum #317 (2005-2006) (Attachment 1). Through the many efforts of our School Board, staff, and many partners in the community parent groups, school business partnerships, Assembly, Mayor, Legislature, and Governor—the second session of the Twenty-fourth Alaska State Legislature passed and signed by the Governor on May 22, 2006, House Bill 365 which appropriates funding for House Bill 13. House Bill 13, scheduled to be signed by the Governor on May 25, 2006, authorizes an increase in the Alaska Public School Funding Program and for a one-time School Improvement Grant award. The legislative changes to the formula for State funding of public education will provide State revenue increases to the District's General Fund of approximately \$1,882,671 due to the base student allocation increase of \$28 from \$5,352 to \$5,380. (The amount included in AO 2006-37(S) took the base student allocation from \$4,919 to \$5,352, an increase of \$433 for an overall student base allocation increase of \$461.) In addition to the \$28 base student allocation, the one-time School Improvement Grant award of \$3,993,800 was incorporated into the District's revenue and expenditure plan. Also with other state, federal and local revenue adjustments an additional \$640,000 is anticipated to be received. The revenue adjustments appropriated through House Bill 365 and other adjustments set forth in this memorandum, results in a net increase to the General Fund of \$6,516,471 for a total in the General Fund of \$473,432,647.

39 40 The attached memorandum (Revised Attachment 1 with Revised Attachment B outlines the revenue and expenditure revisions submitted by the Administration and approved by the School Board with a slight expenditure modification. The net increase in revenues of \$6,516,471 provides the District with the opportunity to reinstate nine middle school elective team planning teachers, two middle school counselors, and 17.8 FTE Full Day Kindergarten assistants, and make other changes to enhance student performance based on updated information and a review of current program needs, building-level life and safety issues and compliance with Title IX requirement issues.

SUMMARY:

The following schedule summarizes the District's FY 2006-2007 Revised Financial Plan by fund, the adjustments that have been approved by the School Board. The difference between \$6,689,639 found in Attachment 1 and the \$6,516,471 increase in this memorandum is \$353,168. The \$353,168 is the previously approved increase in the local property tax appropriation (AO 2006-37(S)) by the Anchorage Assembly on March 28, 2006.

ASD Goals: Ensure public accountability through continued preparation and publication of budget basics, and budget; and effective communications with students, staff, parents, community and government at all levels.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is the Administration's recommendation that the School Board approve a net budget increase of \$6,869,639 to the General Fund for a total revised budget of \$614,742,862 and authorize the Superintendent to prepare the Anchorage School District's FY 2006-2007 Revised Financial Plan as set forth in the projected revenue and expenditure schedules in the memorandum (Attachments A and B). The total budget recommendation is \$614,742,862. This includes individual fund budgets currently projected as follows:

It is also the Administration's recommendation that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to request the Anchorage Assembly to increase the upper limit of the Anchorage School District's FY 2006-2007 budget to \$614,742,862 since the overall budget, as revised, will exceed the approved upper limit of the budget. No additional local property taxes are being requested to support this increase.

PERTINENT FACTS:

Assembly Actions

On March 28, 2006 the Anchorage Assembly approved AO No. 2006-37(S), to adopt and approve the Anchorage School District's FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan with an upper limit spending authority of \$608,226,391 and the amount of \$191,602,288 to be appropriated from local property taxes or other local sources.

The AO No. 2006-37(S) revision was based on the new construction amount increasing slightly since the Assembly approval in March allowing additional taxes under the tax cap limitation. Due to the timing requirements of setting the mill rates for the Municipality of Anchorage and the Alaska Legislature's confirmation of additional funding for the School District, the Anchorage Assembly approved the 2006 calendar taxes with the assumption that the School District would be coming forward with a budget revision to increase the upper limit in support of the Anchorage School District, based on the legislative action.

GENERAL FUND

This memorandum includes a net increase of \$6,869,639 to the General Fund revenues and is summarized on Attachment A. Also included is \$6,869,639 of net expenditure increases, decreases and budgetary reinstatements. These changes are summarized on Attachment B.

Revenues

State Revenues — Alaska Legislative Action

Alaska Public School Funding

Student Base Allocation — Through many efforts of our School Board, staff, many partners in the community, parent groups, Assembly, Mayor, Legislature, and Governor — the second session of the Twenty-fourth Alaska State Legislature approved increasing the base student allocation in the Alaska Public School Funding formula by \$461, from \$4,919 to \$5,380. During the initial planning, the School Board directed the Administration to use the Governor's most current proposal which at that time was \$5,352, an increase of \$433 from the FY 2005-2006 base student allocation of \$4,919. With the additional \$28 recently passed by the Legislature, from \$5,352 to \$5,380, the Anchorage School District will receive an additional \$1,882,671 that has not been previously included in the FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan.

During FY 2004-2005, the Anchorage School District received an overpayment of Federal Impact Aid funding. The error occurred when the State Department of Education and Early Development double-counted a portion of the Special Education student count on the Federal application. The amount of overpayment was \$1,368,934. This amount was refunded to the Federal Impact Aid program during FY 2005-2006. The Alaska Public School Funding Program Formula uses the prior year's Federal Impact Aid receipts when calculating the amount of revenue that the individual districts receive the following year. For FY 2006-2007, this refund reduces the amount of Federal Impact Aid eligible for reporting on the request for Alaska Public School Funding by \$1,368,934. The end result is an increase in the FY 2006-2007 Alaska Public School Funding Program by \$645,000.

School Improvement Grant — In addition to the base student allocation, the Legislature provided under HB13 for a School Improvement Grant as a component of public school funding for one year only. The District is eligible to receive a school improvement grant in the amount of the District's ADM for FY 2006-2007 multiplied by \$81.25. The calculation of the <u>one-time grant award</u> for the District is \$3,993,800.

Local Revenues

Local Property Taxes—When the FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan was submitted to the Anchorage Assembly for approval on March 14, 2006 with AO No. 2006-37, the amount of new construction and property improvement (a component in the calculations for the local property tax contribution from the Municipality of Anchorage), had not been finalized. Subsequently, prior to the final approval on March 28, 2006, the new construction and property improvement amounts were finalized and this allowed for an additional \$353,168. This was approved in the District's FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan upper limit authorization with passage by the Anchorage Assembly of AO No. 2006-37(S). The local property tax revenue included and approved by the Anchorage Assembly for FY 2006-2007 is based on the full amount of taxes available under the local property tax limitation and therefore no further action by the Assembly is required.

<u>Facilities Rentals</u>—After review of current year receipts and the projected amount of anticipated revenue based on increasing selected rental areas; e.g. auditoriums, it has been determined that the revenue projections might have been too aggressive for FY 2006-2007. Therefore, it is recommended at this time to reduce the Facilities Rentals revenue projections by \$75,000.

High School Activity Fees—After review of the student activity fees it was determined to increase the student activity fees at the High School level from \$125 to \$130 for and additional \$30,000. In addition, with the new Girl's Flag Football program, it is anticipated that an additional \$40,000 will be collected. A new family cap of \$325 up from the current amount of \$300, will be in place at the Middle and High School levels for FY 2006-2007.

Expenditures

Reinstated Items

- Full Day Kindergarten Aides-17.8 FTE—\$538,349 These funds would allow the Elementary Division to add back the 17.8 FTE for the all day kindergarten classrooms to have the support of a 3.5 hour teaching assistant.
- Middle School Counselors-2 FTE—\$156,372 These funds would allow the Middle School division to add back the two counselor positions which will provide more time to assist student/teacher concerns.
- Middle School Elective Team Planning 9 FTE—\$703,674 These funds will allow for the elective teachers to have the team planning time available for the middle schools core teams.
- Director of Program Evaluation from .6 FTE to 1 FTE—\$46,500 The program requirements of the Assessment and Evaluation Department necessitate that this position be full time.

Updated Information

- Settled Contracts—\$651,000 The TOTEM Association of Educational Support Personnel (Clerical and Teacher Assistants) recently negotiated a new three-year contract with the District. Funds for this increase were not previously included in the FY 2006-2007 Financial Plan. Also included is consideration for the new 90-day waiting period for medical benefits for Anchorage Council of Education (ACE), TOTEM, Non-Rep and Exempt contracts.
- Utility Rate and Usage—\$500,000 Updated rate information from the utility companies and the U.S Army and projected usage for heat, electricity and refuse requires additional funds for FY 2006-2007.
- Administrative Assistants—2 FTE—\$93,200 With the failure of the April 2006 bond propositions and the reduction of construction and renewal projects it is requested that the two positions supporting the Accounts

Payable and Purchasing Departments be transferred from the Capital Projects Fund. These positions are necessary to maintain the current level of service within the District. A reduction of these positions will decrease service and cause a delay in getting payments to the vendors resulting in late fees and materials to the schools or any administrative unit within the District on a timely basis.

• Charter Schools—\$56,653 This expenditure amount is the Charter Schools portion resulting from the Base Student Allocation increasing from \$5,352 to \$5,380.

New Items

- Assistant Principal—\$95,000 This position will be placed in the Elementary Division to assist with Special Education requirements.
- Special Education Teachers 3 FTE—\$234,558 The additional Special Service Teacher positions are needed to staff the new residential treatment program which will open at North Star Hospital in August, 2006.
- Student Travel—\$45,000 These funds will allow for additional travel to State interscholastic competitions and to offset additional transportation costs created by adding the South Anchorage and Eagle River High Schools.
- Offset Equipment Operator—\$77,000 Due to the District printing demands to maximize facility and equipment use and to better meet the needs of the District the addition of a third offset equipment operator position at KCC is being requested.
- Substitute Teachers Daily Rate Adjustment—\$115,000 The District is currently running with "unfilled" substitute requests (10 to 50 per day). By implementing a more differentiated pay scale that rewards substitutes who take "hard-to-fill" jobs, it is hoped that the increase in pay would attract more substitutes to those jobs.

One-Time Expenditure Items

A review of one-time expenditure needs to match the one-time revenues is shown on Attachment B, totaling \$3,993,800. Brief explanations of the one-time expenditure items identified on Attachment B are as follows:

• Student Management System—\$2,000,000 These funds will be used to help start the process to implement the Student Management System

- which has been a School Board priority. Other funds will need to be identified before a Request for Proposal can be released.
- Special Education Summer School—\$300,000 These funds will support the Summer School program and Extended School Year. The majority of the costs have been supported by grant carry-over funds in the past. Grants funds are no longer adequate to address the need.
- Electrical Distribution Panels—\$125,000 These funds will provide safety repairs on Lake Otis and Ptarmigan Schools electrical systems. The Lake Otis panel is currently overloaded and requires installation of two panels for the load served. At Ptarmigan one of the original electrical distribution panels is overloaded and requires replacement with a larger higher amperage distribution panel-board. These two life safety projects which were on the failed April 2006 ballot are critical and must move forward immediately.
- Curriculum Materials—\$203,000 These funds will be used for K-6 Science Kits First Use Training which was previously cut from the Title 2 budget (\$20,000); the new edition of the Prismatic Consulting Language Proficiency testing software (\$15,000) for world language assessments; resources for an English 11 pilot in six high schools (\$63,000); rebuilding of geography materials in the elementary schools (\$50,000); teacher training for the District's new to district math teachers (\$20,000); and math program (K-8) curriculum review (\$35,000).
- Girl's Flag Football at the High School Level—\$150,000 These funds are
 for the implementation of a Girl's Flag Football program to meet our
 Title IX gender equity OCR requirements. This amount will be used to
 hire coaches and officials, purchase supplies, equipment and uniforms.
 This new program will help attain parity in the District's sports programs
 offered to girls and boys.
- Indoor Soccer Lease—\$170,000 These funds will be used to lease the Anchorage Sports Dome for the FY 2006-2007 soccer season. This will ensure a full season of soccer for all levels of high school competition regardless of snow and ice conditions on the outdoor fields.
- High School Offset of Vending Machine Revenue Loss—\$300,000 These funds will be added to the activities budgets at the High School level to help replace the loss of revenues generated by vending machines. (See Revised Attachment B)

- Middle Level Offset of Vending Machine Revenue Loss—\$50,000 These funds will be added to the activities budgets at the Middle Level to help replace the loss of revenues generated by vending machines. (See Revised Attachment B)
- Elementary Intervention Support—\$322,850 These funds will be used for the Houghton-Mifflin implementation at 14 elementary schools (\$213,000) and for learning intervention opportunities (\$109,850) for students who are below proficiency to improve their academic achievement in the areas of reading, writing and math.
- Middle School Learning Intervention Support—\$50,000 These funds will allow middle school staff to offer reading and writing support for students who are below proficiency.
- High School Learning Intervention Support—\$50,000 These funds will be used for remediation efforts in the areas of reading, writing and math.
- Special Education Learning Intervention Support—\$50,000 These funds will be used to provide additional support for an academic achievement/supportive and effective learning environment at Whaley School.
- Assessment and Evaluation Data Assessment Support—\$25,000 To meet the requirements placed on the Assessment Department, it is requested that \$25,000 be placed in contracted services to provide assistance with the increase demands for data requests and analysis.
- Russian Immersion Support—\$15,000 These funds will be used for the expansion of Russian immersion to grade 3.
- Physical Education—\$23,350 These funds will be used for one-half day in-service training for new to the district/grade level Great Body Shop training and setup and implementation of the elementary Cross Country Jamboree.
- Implementation of IFAS Benefits Module—\$10,000 The funds will be used for training and extra help in implementing the Benefits Module which will allow for electronic tracking of the new 90-day waiting period for medical benefits.
- Classified Advertisement—\$10,000 The funds will allow the District to run advertisements which list multiple positions on a more frequent

basis, and encourage applicants to visit our website. This will allow the District greater visibility locally.

• Charter Schools Improvement Grant—\$139,600 This expenditure amount is the Charter Schools portion resulting from the one-time improvement grant.

OTHER FUNDS

There are no requested changes for the other funds. The Food Service Fund at \$15,000,000, the Debt Service Fund at \$77,310,215 and the Local/State/Federal Grants Fund at \$49,000,000 are recommended to remain as approved by the Anchorage Assembly on March 28, 2006.
