1 2	A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING THE CONTRIBUTIONS TO ANCHORAGE OF THE LATE DAVE ROSE
3 4 5 6	WHEREAS, David A. Rose began his service to Anchorage as a community volunteer soon after his arrival as a member of the U.S. Army in 1960; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, in 1964, Mr. Rose helped build the first synagogue in Anchorage, Temple Beth Sholom, and later he was elected president of the congregation; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, in 1966, Mayor Elmer Rasmuson appointed Mr. Rose to the Parks and Recreation Commission, a body of which he became chairman and which wrote Anchorage's first parks plan, foreseeing our current trail system and many other amenities; and
13 14 15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, in 1971, Mr. Rose ran for and was elected to the Anchorage City Council and the Greater Anchorage Area Borough; was reelected to those positions in 1974 and 1975; was elected to the Municipal Assembly in 1975 and reelected in 1977; and continued to serve the Mountain View, downtown and Government Hill areas until he chose not to seek reelection in 1980; and
20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, while a council member and borough assembly member, Mr. Rose advocated for unification of the city and borough of Anchorage, and upon unification he served as the first chairman of the Municipal Assembly, leading it through the reorganization of two governments into one, which required rewrite of 40 major sections of the Municipal Code and approval of 2,640 legislative items; and
25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, the most controversial issue of unification concerned the equal rights ordinance which, as proposed, listed sexual orientation with other protected classes, and which Mr. Rose courageously defended despite a Mayoral veto and angry community debate; and
30 31 32 33 34	WHEREAS, in 1978, Mr. Rose ran for mayor of Anchorage and made a strong showing in the general election, but lost support in the run-off election due to the sexual orientation issue, yet he refused to retreat from his stand, later saying, "I make no apologies for my position on equal rights. I have never deserted a minority of any type for political expediency;" and

WHEREAS, after leaving local government, Mr. Rose went on to serve as the first executive director of the Alaska Permanent Fund where his decade of service was marked by integrity,

1	financial success, and establishment of policies that continue to serve the state of Alaska well;

4	WHEREAS, in February, 2006 the Anchorage Assembly renamed Conifer Park as Dave Rose
5	Park; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Rose died on May 27, 2006;
8	
9	NOW THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZES the contributions of
10	Dave Rose to Anchorage and Alaska, and joins the entire Anchorage community in mourning his
11	loss.
