TITLE 21 REWRITE PROJECT SCHEDULE UPDATE

The MOA Planning Department is continuing its work on the rewrite and update of the Title 21 Land Use Regulations of the Anchorage Municipal Code. The code rewrite is a complex project with the potential to effect positive change in the Municipality's future. The proposed new code has over a dozen chapters, some of which set out basic provisions, and some of which propose significant changes to development standards.

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Due to the extensive public review process and number of complex issues associated with the Title 21 rewrite to date, the Administration and the Planning Department have prepared a revised timeline. The revised schedule proposes to begin the review and approval process of some chapters in the fall of 2006, while providing time for an economic impact analysis to be performed on the major chapters before a public hearing draft of those chapters is released.

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The schedule anticipates adoption of Chapter 1, General Provisions; Chapter 2, Boards, Commissions, and Municipal Administration; Chapter 8, Subdivision Standards; and Chapter 13, Enforcement; before the end of 2006. If adopted, these chapters would not become effective until the remaining chapters are adopted, which is proposed for the third quarter of 2007. (Note: Chapter 9, Girdwood Land Use Regulations; and Chapter 11, Signs have already been adopted and are in effect. They will need to be updated to match the formatting of the new code, which will be done after adoption of the rest of the code.)

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An economic impact analysis is proposed to be performed on Chapter 3, Review and Approval Procedures; Chapter 4, Zoning Districts; Chapter 5, Use Regulations; Chapter 6, Dimensional Standards and Measurements; Chapter 7, Development and Design Standards; and Chapter 12, Nonconformities. After the analysis is finished, a public hearing draft of those chapters will be released and the review and approval process will begin. Throughout the review and hearing process, it will be important to keep chapters 4 and 5 linked together, as the districts and uses are inter-related, and chapters 6 and 7 linked, as they describe all the development standards.

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THE ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDS THE ASSEMBLY ENDORSE THE REVISED TIMELINE FOR THE TITLE 21 REWRITE PROJECT AS SHOWN IN ATTACHMENT A.
