#### ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2007-55

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 16 TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 16.75 CREATING AUTHORITY AND PROCEDURES FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FATALITY REVIEWS.

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#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code title 16 is hereby amended to add a new chapter 16.75, entitled Domestic Violence Fatality Reviews, to read as follows:

### Chapter 16.75 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FATALITY REVIEWS

16.75.010	Intent
16.75.020	Definitions
16.75.030	Composition and Duties of Advisory Committee
16.75.040	Composition and Duties of Fatality Review Teams
16.75.050	Meetings
16.75.060	Confidentiality

#### 16.75.010 Intent.

This chapter is authorized under Alaska Statutes 18.66.400, and is designed to provide the guidelines for a municipal domestic violence fatality review process pursuant to Alaska law. The purpose is to reduce domestic violence-related injuries and fatalities by reviewing <u>fatal incidents of domestic violence and incidents of domestic violence involving serious physical injury domestic violence-related injuries and fatalities and making recommendations designed to identify prevention strategies and to strengthen system policies.</u>

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#### **16.75.020 Definitions.**

Advisory Committee means a team co-chaired by a representative of the Anchorage Police Department and a representative from a domestic violence victim service agency.

Fatality Review Team means a team designated by the Advisory Committee to review specific a domestic-violence related injury or fatality and to report back to the Advisory Committee as described in this chapter.

## Serious physical injury has the same meaning as defined in Alaska's criminal law Title 11 at AS 11.81.900(56).

#### 16.75.030 Composition and Duties of Advisory Committee.

- A. Chairpersons. The Anchorage Police Department Chief of Police shall designate one representative as co-chair along with a domestic violence victim service agency director or his/her designee. The domestic violence victim service agency director will be designated by the Advisory Committee to serve a two-year term.
- B. *Members*. The Advisory Committee shall be comprised of:
  - 1. Chief of Police, Anchorage Police Department or designee; and
  - 2. A domestic violence victim service agency director or designee, appointed by the Advisory Committee for a two-year term; and
  - 3. Municipal Attorney, Municipality of Anchorage, Department of Law or designee; and
  - 4. Director, Municipality of Anchorage Department of Health and Human Services, or designee; and
  - 5. Director, Alaska Office of Victims' Rights, or designee; and
  - 6. Director, Alaska Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, or designee; and
  - 7. Attorney General, State of Alaska, or designee; and
  - 8. Chief Justice or Administrative Director, Alaska Court System, or designee; and

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- 9. At-large members, not to exceed three (3), appointed by the Advisory Committee to serve two-year terms, may include representation from civil rights and public defense advocacy groups.
- C. Quorum. A quorum shall consist of a majority of members present and shall include at least five (5) members.
- D. Duties.
  - 1. Develop and implement appropriate protocols and policies, according to local needs and resources; and
  - 2. Meet at least quarterly to choose cases of fatal incidents of domestic violence and incidents of domestic violence involving serious physical injury for review, to designate advisory committee members, to designate participants for individual fatality review teams, to oversee the fatality review team process, to gather and disseminate necessary information to team members, and to destroy confidential information at the close of fatality reviews; and
  - 3. Collect and maintain data as appropriate; and
  - 4. Review individual team reports to identify trends and to make recommendations; and
  - 5. Prepare a preliminary report to he Assembly on the work of the Advisory Committee for the first nine months one year after the effective date of this ordinance, the report covering status of work and the overall effectiveness of implementation; and
  - **6.**[5.] Based on these reviews, write and publish a report to the public every two years; and
  - 7.[6.] Distribute the public report to the Office of the Mayor, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly, and the Anchorage Women's Commission.

#### 16.75.040 Composition and Duties of Fatality Review Teams.

A. Composition. The Advisory Committee shall designate individual fatality review team membership based upon the circumstances of each injury or fatality.

B. *Duties*. The Advisory Committee shall determine the duties of the fatality review teams.

#### 16.75.050 Meetings.

All meetings held by the Advisory Committee and the individual domestic violence fatality review teams are closed to the public and are not subject to the open meetings provisions of A.S. 44.62.310 and A.S. 44.62.312.

#### 16.75.060 Confidentiality.

- A. Records or other information collected by the Advisory Committee, any fatality review team, or member of a committee or review team, related to duties under this section are confidential and not subject to the public records disclosure provisions under A.S. 40.25.100 and A.S. 40.25.110, except a public report issued by the Advisory Committee without confidential information.
- B. The determinations, conclusions, and recommendations of a domestic violence fatality review process are not admissible in a civil or criminal proceeding, including:
  - 1. A member may not be compelled to disclose a determination, conclusion, recommendation, discussion, or thought process through discovery or testimony in a civil or criminal proceeding; and
  - Records and information collected by the committee or team are not subject to discovery or subpoena in connection with a civil or criminal proceedings.
- C. Notwithstanding subsection B. above, any person or member may testify in a civil or criminal proceeding concerning cases reviewed by a domestic violence fatality review team as required by law. However, no person or member may disclose any information or documents solely obtained through, or as the result of, participation in a fatality review team.
- D. Pursuant to AS 18.66.400, and notwithstanding any provision in chapter 2.60 to the contrary, the records and actions of the Advisory Committee and individual fatality review teams are not subject to review by the office of the Ombudsman.
- E. Nothing in this chapter supersedes the legal responsibility of any Advisory Committee or individual fatality review team member with a duty to report,

a duty to warn, or a duty to disclose certain types or categories of information to local, state and/or law-related agencies. The purpose of the ordinance is to provide a process with a goal to reducing 10 injuries and fatalities, and to make recommendations designed to identify prevention 11 12 strategies. 13 14 This legislation is the end result of many years of task force work, including passage of enabling legislation through the State, and the on-going commitment of the Alaska Court 15 System, State of Alaska's Attorney General and District Attorney offices, Municipality of 16 Anchorage's Municipal Attorney and Prosecutor offices, Anchorage Police Department, 17 Municipality of Anchorage's Department of Health & Human Services, State of Alaska's 18 Office of Victim's Rights, Abused Women's Aid in Crisis, Inc. (AWAIC), Alaska Women's 19 Resource Center, and the Council on Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault, among others. 20 21 22 The provisions of this ordinance are authorized by Alaska Statute 18.66.400, including provisions regarding the confidentiality of records reviewed by the team and exemption from 23 the Open Meetings Act. A copy of the enabling legislation is attached. 24 25 Domestic violence has a devastating impact upon families, neighbors, communities and the 26 Municipality of Anchorage. Tragically, in the nation, Alaska ranks high in deaths due to 27 28 domestic violence. # Alaska Statutes 18.66.400. Domestic violence fatality review teams.

- The commissioner of public safety may establish domestic violence (a) fatality review teams in areas of the state. A municipality may establish a domestic violence fatality review team in a municipality. When the investigation of fatal incidents of domestic violence and incidents of domestic violence involving serious physical injury has been completed or adjudicated by law enforcement or at an earlier appropriate time, a domestic violence fatality review team may review those incidents for the purpose of preventing domestic-violence-related fatalities, improving the response of enforcement and other agencies to domestic violence, and providing consultation and coordination for agencies involved in the prevention and investigation of domestic violence. The review may include a review of events leading up to the domestic violence incident, available community resources, current laws and policies, actions taken by agencies and persons related to the incident and persons involved in the incident, and other information the team determines to be relevant to the review. The confidential and other records of a department or agency of the state or a municipality relating to the domestic violence incident may be examined by the domestic violence fatality review team or a member of the team. The domestic violence fatality review team and each member of the team shall preserve the confidentiality of any records examined. In this subsection, "serious physical injury" has the meaning given in AS 11.81.900.
- (b) The membership of a domestic violence fatality review team shall be determined by the commissioner of public safety or the municipality, as appropriate. Membership may include representatives from
  - (1) law enforcement agencies within the area or municipality;
  - (2) the district attorney for the area or municipality and municipal prosecutor if created by a municipality;
  - (3) the office of the chief medical examiner;
  - (4) the Department of Corrections;

- (5) employees of the Department of Health and Social Services who deal with domestic violence;
- (6) local agencies and organizations involved with crime victim and domestic violence protection, reporting, and counseling and assistance:
- (7) other organizations, departments, and agencies determined to be appropriate.
- (c) The victims' advocate under AS 24.65 is an ex officio member of each domestic violence fatality review team created under this section and may attend any meeting and review any information available to or considered by a team.
- (d) Except for a public report issued by a domestic violence fatality review team that does not contain confidential information, records or other information collected by a team or any member of a team related to duties under this section is confidential and not subject to public disclosure under <u>AS 40.25.100</u> and 40.25.110. Meetings of a domestic violence fatality review team are closed to the public and are not subject to the provisions of <u>AS 44.62.310</u> and 44.62.312.
- (e) The determinations, conclusions, and recommendations of a domestic violence fatality review team or its members are not admissible in a civil or criminal proceeding. A member may not be compelled to disclose a determination, conclusion, recommendation, discussion, or thought process through discovery or testimony in a civil or criminal proceeding. Records and information collected by the team are not subject to discovery or subpoena in connection with a civil or criminal proceeding.
- (f) Notwithstanding (e) of this section, an employee of a state or a municipal agency may testify in a civil or criminal proceeding concerning cases reviewed by a domestic violence fatality review team even though the agency's records were reviewed by a team and formed the basis of that employee's testimony and the team's report.
- (g) A person who serves on a domestic violence fatality review team is not liable for damages or other relief in an action brought by reason of the performance of a duty, function, or activity of the team.
