ORDINANCE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AT THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON APRIL 1, 2008, A BALLOT PROPOSITION AMENDING HOME RULE CHARTER ARTICLE IV, THE ASSEMBLY, SECTION 4.02, TERM, MEMBERSHIP AND QUALIFICATION, TO ESTABLISH A THREE-YEAR TERM IF SINGLE MEMBER DISTRICTS ARE ESTABLISHED; AND PROVIDING FOR SHORTER TERMS **DURING IMPLEMENTATION.**

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That a ballot proposition in substantially the same form as appears in Section 2 below shall be placed on the ballot and submitted to the qualified voters of the Municipality at the regular municipal election of April 1, 2008.

That the proposition shall be presented in substantially the following form: Section 2.

CHARTER AMENDMENT

TRANSITION TO SINGLE MEMBER ELECTION DISTRICTS WITH ASSEMBLY MEMBERS SERVING FULL TERMS OF THREE YEARS AND TRANSITIONAL SHORTER TERMS AS PROVIDED BY ORDINANCE

Shall Anchorage Municipal Charter Article IV Assembly, Section 4.02, Term, Membership and Qualification, to make the full term of an assembly member three years, and provide for shorter transitional terms by ordinance when all assembly members are elected from single member districts?

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Section 4.02. Term, membership and qualifications.


- (a) If all <u>assembly members</u> [ASSEMBLYMEN] are elected from single member districts, the term of an <u>assembly member</u> [ASSEMBLYMAN] is <u>three</u> [TWO] years. If some or all <u>assembly members</u> [ASSEMBLYMEN] are elected from multi-member districts, the term of an <u>assembly member</u> [ASSEMBLYMAN] is three years. <u>The Assembly by ordinance may establish transitional terms shorter than the full three-year term to implement a change between some or all <u>assembly members being elected from multi-member districts and all assembly members being elected from single member districts. A transitional term shorter than three years shall not be included as a consecutive term for purposes of term limitation under (e) of this section.</u></u>
- (b) A candidate for the office of <u>assembly member [ASSEMBLYMAN]</u>:
 - (1) Shall be a qualified voter of Anchorage; and
 - (2) Shall be a resident of the district from which he/she seeks election for at least one year immediately preceding the election.
- (c) An <u>assembly member</u> [ASSEMBLYMAN] shall remain a resident of Anchorage and of the district from which elected while in office.
- (d) The assembly shall be the judge of the election and qualification of its members. A qualified voter may appeal to superior court for review of a decision of the assembly under this section.
- (e) A person who has served on the assembly for three consecutive terms may not be reelected to the assembly until one full term has intervened.

<u>Section 3</u>. Section 1 of this ordinance proposing amendment to the Home Rule Charter for the Municipality of Anchorage shall become effective upon passage and approval by a two-thirds vote of the total membership of the Assembly as set forth in Charter Section 18.02.

AO 2007-153 — AN ORDINANCE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AT THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON APRIL 1, 2008, A BALLOT PROPOSITION AMENDING HOME RULE CHARTER ARTICLE IV, THE ASSEMBLY, SECTION 4.02, TERM, MEMBERSHIP AND QUALIFICATION, TO ESTABLISH A THREE-YEAR TERM IF SINGLE MEMBER DISTRICTS ARE ESTABLISHED; AND PROVIDING FOR SHORTER TERMS DURING

IMPLEMENTATION.

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Under Section 4.01 of Home Rule Charter, the Assembly shall consist of 11 members. Section 4.02 of the Charter allows the Assembly by ordinance to establish single-member election districts, or a combination of single member and multi-member districts. Currently, there are a total of six election districts: five two-member election districts, and one singlemember district. Initially it may have been anticipated that single-member representation would rotate among the six election districts. Rotation of single-member representation among election districts is not feasible, so the downtown election district has remained the only single-member district.

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Presently the Charter specifies that when all districts are single-member, the term of office shall be two years, instead of three. As Anchorage grows and issues facing the Assembly become more complex, a two-year term is too short.

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The proposed ordinance authorizes a ballot proposition amending the Charter to allow the Assembly to retain three-year terms, were the Assembly to exercise its present ability under the Charter to transition to single-member districts. The proposed ordinance does not implement a transition to single-member districts. Actual transition to single-member districts requires a separate ordinance to address specific timing, election cycles, and redistricting. Transition details do not require Charter amendment and would be worked out in full Assembly review, outside the scope of the present ordinance.

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The present ordinance is limited to proposing a charter amendment to establish a full term of three years (whether the election districts are single-member or a combination of singlemember and multi-member districts) and allows for shorter terms during a transition. This ordinance has been reviewed and discussed in draft by the Assembly Elections Committee and is offered for consideration by the Assembly.
