20 21 22	WHEREAS, Alaska's long winters and cold climate have posed unique challenges to the Alaska Zoo in their efforts to house Maggie in a safe environment appropriate to her species, origins, and physical needs, requiring heroic measures to ensure her safety, health, and quality of life; and				
23 24 25	WHEREAS, despite best efforts of the Alaska Zoo and the Anchorage community, Maggie is experiencing serious medical problems which are exacerbated by the limitations of her living quarters in the northern climate; and
