A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING NINETY SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$97,000) OF ANTICIPATED UNEARNED REVENUES TO THE AREAWIDE FUND (101) 2007 FINANCE DEPARTMENT GENERAL GOVERNMENT OPERATING BUDGET TO PAY COSTS RELATED TO: (1) A NEWLY ESTABLISHED WAGE GARNISHMENT PROGRAM FOR COLLECTING DELINQUENT CRIMINAL FINES AND (2) PROJECTED INCREASES IN COLLECTION AGENCY COMMISSIONS TIED TO GREATER COLLECTIONS OF DELINQUENT CRIMINAL AND CIVIL FINES AND FEES

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WHEREAS, over the past four years the Municipality's Finance Department has significantly improved its ability to collect delinquent criminal and civil fines and fees by pursuing special Information Technology and operational initiatives with both the Alaska Court System and the Anchorage Police Department, collecting in excess of \$13 million owed through the efforts of internal staff and external collection agencies; and

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WHEREAS, during the Summer of 2007 the Municipality's Finance Department successfully worked with State of Alaska / Department of Labor to begin to receive employer information in support of a new initiative to garnish wages of delinquent debtors owing criminal fine judgment cases; and

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WHEREAS, the Municipality's external collection agencies are paid commission only for delinquent criminal and civil fines and fee cases in which dollars are successfully collected; and whereas these agencies have exhibited a stronger than anticipated upward trend in their collections during the first 8 months of 2007; now therefore,

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THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

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That NINETY SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$97,000) of anticipated unearned revenues Section 1. are hereby appropriated to the Areawide Fund (101) 2007 Finance Department General Government Operating Budget to fund costs related to: (1) a newly established wage garnishment program for collecting delinquent criminal fines and (2) projected increases in Collection Agency commissions tied to greater collections of delinguent criminal and civil fines and fees.

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This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Section 2. Municipal Assembly.

SUBJECT: Appropriating \$97,000 from Anticipated Unearned Revenues to the Areawide

Fund (101) 2007 Finance Department General Government Operating Budget, to pay costs related to wage garnishment and collection agency commissions

associated with collection of delinquent criminal / civil fines and fees

The Administration requests approval of the attached Assembly Resolution to appropriate \$97,000 from anticipated unearned revenues to the Areawide Fund (101) Finance Department 2007 General Government Operating Budget, to pay two categories of new and increased costs related to collection of delinquent criminal / civil fines and fees, namely:

Wage Garnishment of Criminal Fines

During the summer of 2007 the Municipality entered into an agreement with Department of Labor whereby they will provide employer data to the Municipality to assist in garnishing wages associated with unpaid criminal fine judgment cases. All costs of this new program are to be borne by the Municipality per federal Department of Labor rules. The initial setup fee is \$25,000 and each data request made by the Municipality will be charged \$7,500. The 2007 supplemental appropriation will provide sound of new, additional funding within the Finance Department (i.e., Treasury Division) operating budget to pay these necessary costs. In addition, the Court System requires that all debtors affected by wage garnishment must be personally served; process server costs are ultimately reimbursed by the debtor, however, the Municipality must front the initial estimated cost of \$24,000.

A broad-based wage garnishment attempt, affecting up to 1,200 debtors, is expected to occur during the 4th quarter of 2007. Earlier this year a test file with Department of Labor generated a 75% match rate against a randomly selected population of debtors. The median individual, unpaid judgment case balance is \$500. Assuming a batch of 1,200 matched debtors from the Department of Labor employer database, the Municipality expects to collect up to \$600,000 from this first round of wage garnishment. The "net" revenues, after paying Department of Labor and Process Server Costs, will be credited to the Anchorage Police Department.

Collection Agency Commissions

Since 2004 the Municipality has employed two external collection agencies specializing in the collection of delinquent criminal / civil fines and fees (i.e., unpaid court judgment cases). Over time these two collection agencies have increased their ability to collect cases on behalf of the Municipality. These agencies currently earn a 30% commission for any dollar amounts collected on cases referred by the Municipality. Thus far in 2007 the collection rate for both agencies has been stronger than anticipated (i.e., up 7% year-to-date) and the 2007 budget for commissions is expected to fall short by as much as \$40,500. The collection agencies'

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successes from now through the end of 2007 will be credited to the Anchorage Police Department after netting out commission expense.

The associated collection-related costs for both the wage garnishment and collection agency efforts (i.e., Department of Labor costs, Process Server Costs, and Collection Agency Commissions) are all to be budgeted as an expense and as an offsetting, anticipated unearned revenue within the Treasury budget.
