A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY ADOPTING RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BOARD OF ETHICS IN THE MATTER OF ETHICS BOARD CASE NUMBER 2007-1 REGARDING A VIOLATION OF ETHICS CODE § 1.15.070.K BY ASSEMBLY MEMBER PAUL BAUER IN SUBMITTING DOCUMENTS FOR FILING WITH THE ETHICS BOARD ALLEGING AN ETHICS VIOLATION AND SUBSEQUENTLY HOLDING A PRESS CONFERENCE TO DISCUSS THE SAME ALLEGED ETHICAL VIOLATION.

WHEREAS, after more than a year of work and based on recommendations of the Ethics Board, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly adopted a new Ethics Code, effective January 1, 2007; and

WHEREAS through numerous work sessions and substantial public deliberation prior to final adoption, the Assembly was mindful of supporting the integrity of the Ethics Board processes by striking an appropriate balance between the public interest in open disclosure and the public interest in not allowing the filing of a complaint with the Ethics Board to become public until the Ethics Board has completed its review and issued a report; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the integrity of the Ethics Code processes, Ethics Code 1.15.070K requires that confidentiality be maintained and that "no person shall knowingly disclose to another person, or otherwise make public, in violation of this chapter, the contents of a notice of potential violation"; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 19, 2007, Assembly Member Bauer delivered to administrative staff of the Ethics Board, documents which he referred to as an Ethics Complaint and requested that the documents be submitted to the Ethics Board; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 20, 2007, Assembly Member Bauer held a press conference alleging an "Ethics Violation" relative to the same subject matter set out in the documents submitted to the Ethics Board; and

 WHEREAS, on or about May 15, 2007, a member of the Ethics Board filed a notice of potential violation against Assembly Member Bauer, based on Assembly Member Bauer's press release and press conference coupled with documents submitted by Assembly Member Bauer to administrative staff and forwarded to the Ethics Board, along with Assembly Member Bauer's request. The Ethics Board member withdrew himself from further participation as an Ethics Board member on this matter, concurrent with the Ethics Board member's filing of the notice of potential violation; and

documents to the Ethics Board and subsequently issuing a press release, substantially similar to the content of the ethics complaint, was in violation of Ethics Code 1.15.070K; and

WHEREAS, the notice of potential violation alleged that submitting the

WHEREAS, on August 17, 2007, the Ethics Board conducted a hearing on the notice of potential violation filed by its member; and

WHEREAS, on September 6, 2007, as required by the Ethics Code, the Ethics Board issued its written report and findings to the Anchorage Assembly which determined that "the filing of a document with the evident intent of making a complaint of violation of the Code of Ethics or the seeking of an Advisory Opinion will trigger the confidentiality provisions of 1.15.070 K...."; and

WHEREAS, this is the first such matter to come before the Assembly since the adoption of the new Ethics Code; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly is required to address the recommendations of the Ethics Board and is also duty-bound to establish principles for the conduct of its Members under the Ethics Code, particularly where there is some uncertainty associated with the requirements of the new Code;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOVED that the Anchorage Assembly, after a detailed and thorough review of this matter by the Chair, the Vice Chair and the Chair of the Ethics Committee, and with the assistance of the Assembly's Attorney, the Assembly adopts the following principles with regard to the confidentiality requirements of the Ethics Code:

- 1. The confidentiality requirements of the Ethics Code are of paramount importance and must be rigorously implemented so as to ensure that the decisions, reports, findings and recommendations of the Ethics Board are without political taint or question. Only in this way, can the Ethics Board perform its vital functions.
- 2. The Ethics Code sets forth a confidentiality requirement. As a new Code, questions arise as to when this requirement is to be imposed. This Assembly determines, as a matter of law, that when any submittal is made to the Ethics Board or to its administrative staff, which sets forth allegations of an ethical violation, the confidentiality provisions of the Ethics Code shall apply. The substance of a complaint to the Ethics Board alleging a violation should be treated as confidential, whether or not the form of the complaint to the Ethics Board is technically correct.
- 3. To avoid undesirable consequences under the Code of Ethics, all Assembly Members are encouraged to act with due deliberation, to seek and follow legal counsel in matters concerning the Ethics Code, and to maintain confidentiality in the process.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Anchorage Assembly hereby adopts the recommendations of the Ethics Board regarding Notice of Potential Violation 2007-1,

1. The Assembly, hereby admonishes Assembly Member Paul Bauer for not maintaining confidentiality after he submitted documents for filing with the Ethics Board, when he subsequently held a press conference at which reference was made to the same alleged ethical violations.

2. The Assembly further requires Assembly Member Paul Bauer to attend and complete appropriate ethics training on the new Ethics Code requirements within six (6) months of the date of this Resolution.
