10 W HEREAAS, the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area was created by
11 Anchorage Ordinance 83-57; and

12
13 WHEREAS, a showing of interest by persons residing in the limited road service
14 area (LRSA) to continue the LRSA beyond December 31, 2007 has been made to
15 the Municipality; and

16
17 WHEREAS, at every regular election subsequent to its formation and prior to the
18 next termination date, a majority of the qualified voters residing in this LRSA have
19 answered in the affirmative to a ballot proposition to continue its existence for three
20 more years; and

21
22 WHEREAS, conducting an election to avoid terminating a limited road service area
23 every three years is costly and should be made unnecessary when there is no
24 grassroots citizen initiative to alter or abolish the limited road service area;

26 THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

28 **Section 1.** A ballot proposition in substantially the following form shall be
29 submitted to the qualified voters residing in the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road
30 Service Area at the regular Municipal election on April 3, 2007:

37 Shall the existence of the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road
38 Service Area be continued until altered or abolished by an affirmative

1 **Section 2.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 27.30.330 is amended to read as
2 follows:

4 **27.30.330 Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area.**

6 A. There is a limited road service area within the municipality known as
7 the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area to provide
8 limited road maintenance and repair to the area described on the map
9 located in section 27.30.700.
10
11 B. Limited road maintenance and repair within the service area shall
12 commence on January 1, 1984, and shall continue in existence until
13 altered or abolished [END ON DECEMBER 31, 2007, UNLESS THE
14 SERVICE AREA IS EXTENDED] by an affirmative vote of the
15 [SERVICE] area affected at an election held prior to the alteration or
16 abolishment of the service area [THE REGULAR ELECTION OF
17 APRIL 2007]. The mill rate shall not exceed 1.0 mill in any calendar
18 year.


24 **Section 3.** AO No. 2006-161, passed and approved on December 19, 2006, is
25 repealed.

27 **Section 4.** Except Section 2, this ordinance shall become effective upon passage
28 and approval. Section 2 and the proposition contained in Section 1 shall become
29 effective upon certification of the regular election on the proposition called for by this
30 ordinance, but only if the proposition is approved by a majority of the qualified voters
31 voting on the proposition.
