

#### AO No. 2008-62

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 26.80 TO ADD A NEW SECTION FOR A SURCHARGE TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY RECYCLING INITIATIVES AND AMENDING SECTION 26.70.040 TO ADD THE SURCHARGE FEES.

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

**Section 1.** Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 26.80 is amended to add a new section for a surcharge to solid waste disposal fees to support community recycling initiatives as follows (the remainder of the chapter is not affected and therefore not set out):

# 26.80.060 Surcharges to support community recycling initiatives.

- A. The solid waste disposal utility shall implement community-wide initiatives to support reduction, recycling, and reuse of waste products that is otherwise disposed of at the landfill.
- B. The solid waste disposal utility shall collect a surcharge on all wastes delivered to solid waste transfer or disposal facilities to finance the implementation of these initiatives.
  - 1. Each user delivering waste to a solid waste transfer or disposal facility in quantities weighing less than 1,000 pounds, and with a total volume of less than 5 cubic yards, shall be assessed a surcharge to the existing disposal fee of \$1.00 per visit.
  - 2. At solid waste transfer or disposal facilities with working scales, each user delivering waste in quantities weighing more than 1,000 pounds or with a total volume greater than 5 cubic yards shall be assessed a surcharge, added to the existing tipping fee, of \$8.00 per ton of waste delivered.
  - 3. At a solid waste transfer or disposal facility with no operational scales, each user meeting the requirements of subsection B.1. shall pay a surcharge to the existing tipping fee of:

- a. \$1.60 per cubic yard of non-compacted solid waste, as measured by the facility attendant; or
- b. \$3.20 per cubic yard of compacted waste as measured by the facility attendant.
- C. Fees collected through the surcharge in this chapter shall be used by the solid waste disposal utility for capital development costs, operating costs, consulting fees, and management fees associated with recycling programs, as approved by the Director. Fees may also be used to offset lost revenues to the disposal utility incurred due to diversion of waste tonnages to recycling efforts.

<u>Section 2.</u> Due to increased operating costs to the Refuse Collection Utility as the result of implementation of this surcharge, Anchorage Municipal Code section 26.70.040, Service requests, rates and billing, is amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

## 26.70.040 Service requests, rates and billing.

- \*\*\* \*\*\* \*\*\*
- C. Rates, fees and charges. Notwithstanding section 26.10.035, the following rates, fees and charges shall be assessed for municipal solid waste collection:
  - 1. Conventional can or bag service.
    - a. Basic monthly charge. This rate covers the weekly collection of a maximum of four collection units, each unit consisting of one conventional 32-gallon garbage can or approved bag. The customer shall place all refuse for collection at the curbside or alley, within three feet of the drivable roadway or alley.

#### **PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:**

- 1) Begining July 1, 2008, Solid Waste Services (SWS) Disposal Revenue will increase due to a tipping fee increase for all customers using the landfill or transfer stations by \$8 per ton to offset costs anticipated by implementation of area-wide recycling initiatives. These fees will be collected on all revenue generating tons (currently 330,000 tons annually). Recycling initiatives will divert approximately 20,000 tons of waste annually starting in 2009.
- 2) Recycling initiatives will divert approximately 20,000 tons of waste annually and will result in an annual revenue loss of approximately \$1,000,000 at the current landfill tipping rate of \$50/ton, without corresponding reduction in operating costs.
- 3) SWS Disposal Expenses will increase \$1,417,000 annually due to: two additional recycling drop-off sites, school district recycling, public space recycling, compost facility clean-up, and public education; \$113,000 of Capital expense are excluded here. Expenses include additional Municipal Utility Service Assessment and revenue distributions associated with increased revenues.
- 4) Expenses in 2009 and subsequent years reflect a reduction in closure liability expense accrual and depreciation expenses associated with extending landfill life by reducing input tonnage.

SWS Collections Utility will be subject to this tipping fee increase which will increase operating costs. See attached SEE.

#### PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

Customers, including commercial waste haulers, businesses and home owners using SWS transfer stations and disposal facilities will pay an additional \$8/ton of weighed garbage. Customers delivering waste to either the landfill or transfer stations will be assessed a surcharge of \$1 per vehicle.

As part of a Comprehensive Integrated Waste Management initiative, the Municipality of Anchorage, through the Economic & Community Development (ECD) and Solid Waste Services (SWS), intends to implement new programs in 2008 including:

- Additional facilities for drop off of recyclable materials within the community;
- · Support for recycling in schools;
- Recycling bins in public venues; and
- Operation of a compost facility for recycling of organic wastes.

These programs are not anticipated to generate revenue, and require capital to develop facilities and purchase equipment, as well as funds for operating expenses. Annual costs for programs expected to be developed in 2008, including annual operating costs as well as amortized capital costs, are estimated to be:

Ongoing programs \$325,000
Additional drop-off sites \$352,000
School district recycling \$326,000
Public space recycling \$75,000
Composting clean-up \$205,000
Public outreach & education \$247,000

Total Area-Wide Services \$1,530,000

In addition, implementation of these programs is predicted to reduce the tonnage of refuse delivered to SWS for disposal by approximately 20,000 tons. This decrease will result in a reduction in revenue to the SWS Disposal Utility by approximately \$1,000,000 at the current landfill tipping fee of \$50, without corresponding reduction to the utility's operating expenses. This surcharge provides additional revenues to ensure the Disposal Utility has adequate operating revenues.

To generate revenues to cover the costs to implement these new programs and to mitigate lost revenues to the refuse disposal utility, the Administration proposes adding a surcharge to all tipping fees collected at SWS-operated solid waste transfer and disposal facilities. Section 1 of the ordinance establishes a recycling surcharge of \$8.00 per ton to the current solid waste disposal tipping fee to fund these programs. Tipping fees are currently collected on approximately 330,000 tons annually.

With the addition of the surcharge to the current tipping fee, operating costs incurred by the SWS Refuse Collection Utility also increases. The Refuse Collection Utility pays the Disposal Utility at the same rate as all other users of the disposal facilities. Section 2 of

the ordinance allows the Refuse Collection Utility to recover costs from the utility's customers associated with the increase in tipping fees by adjusting refuse collection rates for residential and commercial customers. Rates for conventional can/bag service increases by \$1.65 per month, and collection rates for customers using commercial dumpster service rises an average of 5.5% per month. The actual increase in cost for commercial customers is dependent on the size of container and frequency of collection.
