This ordinance authorizes Heritage Land Bank (HLB) to grant a non-exclusive trail easement to the U.S. Forest Service. In 1997, a cooperative trail planning effort between the Girdwood community and local, state and federal agencies produced the "Girdwood-Iditarod Trail Route Study". The proposed route commemorates a segment of the historic trail between Seward and Nome, and links Turnagain Arm to the Crow Pass Iditarod Trailhead in the upper Girdwood Valley. The project was initiated by the Girdwood Trails Committee and the Girdwood Board of Supervisors after the discovery of a four mile-long abandoned historic trail, believed to be a section of the original Iditarod Trail. Project participants studied the feasibility, preferred route, and development standards for restoring the historic trail, to create a "backbone" pedestrian trail in the valley. The Glacier-Winner Creek Trail is one of the side trails leading out from the "backbone" of the Iditarod National Historic Trail (INHT). The easement runs for a distance of approximately 10,132 linear feet. Because the trail provides an important public amenity, HLB recommends no fee to be charged for the easement. In recognition that the trail easement may affect or impede HLB's eventual development of property in the upper Girdwood Valley, the easement provides for relocation of the trail corridor to a mutually suitable location, at the expense of the HLB or its' assignee.



Public Process. The HLB conducted an agency review and received no objection from other municipal agencies for issuance of the easement. The Girdwood Board of Supervisors consistently supported identification of the Iditarod Trail and preservation of the route through easements, and passed Resolution 2004-08 supporting the Glacier Winner Creek segment. The public hearing was advertised in the Anchorage Daily News March 11, 18, and 25, 2008. The HLB Advisory

Commission held a public hearing on March 27, 2008 and approved HLBAC 1 2 Resolution No. 2008-03 (Appendix B). 3 Recommendation. Heritage Land Bank staff considers the proposed issuance of a 4 perpetual, relocatable easement of approximately 10,132 linear feet within the eight 5 parcels to be an appropriate use of HLB land. A RESOLUTION OF THE HERITAGE LAND BANK ADVISORY COMMISSION RECOMMENDING TO THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY THE APPROVAL OF DISPOSAL OF A PORTION OF HLB PARCELS NOs. 6-254, 6-255, 6-268, 6-273, 6-275, 6-279, 6-294, and 6-296 FOR A RELOCATABLE EASEMENT TO THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE TO CONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN THE GLACIER-WINNER CREEK, A COMPONENT OF THE IDITAROD NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL.

WHEREAS, "It is the mission of the Heritage Land Bank to manage uncommitted municipal land ... to benefit the present and future citizens of Anchorage, promote orderly development, and achieve the goals of the comprehensive plan," (AMC 25.40,010); and

WHEREAS, land disposals under AMC 25.40.025.F include land sales, land exchanges, leases, and easements; and

WHEREAS, the United States Forest Service (USFS) has applied for an easement for construction and maintenance of the Glacier-Winner Creek Trail, a segment of the Iditarod National Historic Trail including portions of HLB Parcel Nos. 6-254, 6-255, 6-268, 6-273, 6-275, 6-279, 6-294, and 6-296; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality supports the proposed trail project as consistent with the goals of the Girdwood Area Plan, Heritage Land Bank objectives, and responsible development of the Girdwood Valley, and recognizes the trail, as an amenity enhancing property value and esthetic experience for residents and visitors in the area; and

WHEREAS, USFS has identified a route for the proposed trail between Winner Creek Trail and Crow Creek Road,; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality, through the Heritage Land Bank, could potentially utilize portions of the proposed trail route with residential development and construction of certain public facilities and infrastructure, yet to be determined and located, as called for in the Girdwood Area Plan, requiring a provision in the forthcoming easement to allow relocation of the trail if necessary; and

WHEREAS, USFS will commit to funding design and construction of the trail, and maintenance and enforcement in perpetuity,
