AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 9.44.400, OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY, AND SECTION 15.70.090, MOTOR VEHICLE NOISE EMISSION STANDARDS, TO REQUIRE VEHICLE NOISE AND SAFETY INSPECTIONS AND TO PROVIDE FOR PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION, FEES AND FINES, AND EFFECTIVE DATES.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Anchorage Municipal Code subsection 9.44.400, Owner's responsibility, is hereby amended by adding a new subsection to read as follows (language indicating no amendment is included for context only):

9.44.400 Owner's responsibility.

- It is unlawful for the owner or any other person employing or otherwise Α. directing the driver of any vehicle to cause the operation of the vehicle upon a street in any manner contrary to this Code.
- It is unlawful for an owner to request, cause or permit the operation of any B. vehicle which is not equipped as required by this Code.
- It is the vehicle owner's responsibility to secure a biennial safety <u>C.</u> inspection of the vehicle, to include a compliance certificate verifying that the vehicle is safe to operate and the muffler meets the noise emission standards in AMC 15.70.090.
 - If the vehicle is subject to the motor vehicle emissions inspection 1. and maintenance (I/M) program administered by the municipality, the IM inspection certificate will not be issued unless vehicle safety and muffler compliance are verified under regulations established by the department of health and human services.

(CAC 9.44.400; AO No. 78-72; AO No. 80-4)

Section 2. Anchorage Municipal Code subsection 15.70.090B, Motor vehicle noise emission standards, is hereby amended to read as follows (language indicating no amendment is included for context only):

15.70.090 Motor vehicle noise emission standards.

No person shall operate or cause to be operated a motor vehicle or Α. motorcycle on a public right-of-way at any time in such a manner that the sound level emitted by the motor vehicle or motorcycle exceeds the level set forth in table 2 when measured at 50 feet or more or an equivalent sound level at some other convenient distance according to testing procedures established pursuant to Section 15.70.040.B.1.


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No person shall operate or cause or allow to be operated any motor B. vehicle or motorcycle not equipped with a muffler or other sounddissipative device in good working order and in constant operation. No person shall remove or render inoperative or cause or allow to be removed or rendered inoperative other than for purposes of maintenance, repair or replacement any muffler or sound-dissipative device on a motor vehicle or motorcycle. It is the vehicle owner's responsibility to secure a biennial safety inspection of the vehicle in compliance with AMC 9.44.400, to include a compliance certificate verifying that the vehicle is safe to

IMPLEMENTATION, FEES AND FINES, AND EFFECTIVE DATES.

The purpose of AO 2008-82 is to ensure that the municipal department of health and human services will have the authority and direction from the Assembly to provide for a vehicle safety and muffler noise inspection and certification program.

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Municipal requirements related to vehicle safety are codified now in title 9 of the Anchorage Municipal Code. Muffler specifications are codified now in title 9, with specific noise level mandates in chapter 15.70.

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AO 2008-82 is independent from requirements and exemptions offered under the I/M program. AO 2008-82 is intended to allow the department of health and human services to provide program administration detail under departmental regulations to be reviewed and approved by the Assembly. Implementation of the compliance program under AO 2008-82 is intended to parallel proposed reinstatement and revision to the I/M program, with sufficient flexibility to foster coordination between programs.

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25 26 Vehicle noise pollution and unsafe vehicles are illegal now. The problem is getting worse because there is presently no avenue of viable enforcement. AO 2008-82 proposes periodic mandatory inspection and certification of compliance, for vehicles now governed by title 9 and title 15, including motorcycles.

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AO 2008-82 is drafted in anticipation of the department and health and human services providing input as to timelines and effective dates, in the course of public hearing and assembly deliberation.

PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

DHHS has preliminarily examined the public sector impacts of adding a noise and safety program. Assuming the program will be operated in a manner similar to the current I/M Program and will require adminstrative oversight of private noise and safety testing stations, they have assumed that an additional three FTEs will be required with an estimated on-going cost of approximately \$300,000. DHHS also estimates a cost of roughly \$150,000 in design and start-up costs. They anticipate the need for consulting services to assist in the design of noise and safety testing procedures prior to implementation in 2010. AO 2008-82 does not propose an inspection fee to recover these costs. Alaska DMV may also incur costs if registration is to be tied to a safety and noise inspection requirement.

PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

For the purpose of this analysis DHHS assumed the safety component of an inspection would cost approximately \$20, which is in the same cost range as programs in other States. The cost of the noise component of the inspection would be dependent on the scope of the noise test. Japan requires all vehicles with deteriorated and/or "non-stock" muffler systems to undergo an exhaust noise measurements to determine compliance. Using the Japanese test as a model, DHHS estimates that the average noise inspection would take approximately 20 minutes. At a shop rate of \$70/hr, a noise inspection would cost approximately \$23. The combined cost of a safety and noise inspection would therefore be approximately \$43. Assuming a biennial safety and noise inspection requirement applies only to vehicles 6-years and older that must also meet I/M requirements, the total cost is estimated to be (roughly) \$3M per year. Industry would have to purchase noise monitoring equipment and possibly construct a "semi-anechoic" noise testing chamber to perform tests. These costs are not known at this time but could exceed \$20,000 per inspection facility. The public would also incur costs from any required safety and noise-related repairs.
