AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.75.010 TO REDUCE THE FEE FOR PROGRESS INSPECTIONS AND TO ADD FEES FOR SPECIAL OCCUPANCY INSPECTONS, FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEMS REPORT REVIEW, AND STANDBY FIRE SERVICE OPERATIONS.

## THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: Anchorage Municipal Code section 10.75.010 is amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

# 10.75.010 Fees for inspections by the Anchorage Fire Department.

- A. Basic inspection fee. The Anchorage Fire Department shall charge a fee of \$35.00 for each inspection required for licensing, permitting, or life safety by the municipality, state government, or federal government when such inspection occurs.
  - 1. Where a building owner or tenant provides evidence to the Fire Marshal of progress toward compliance of required deficiencies, the Fire Marshal may, on a case-by-case basis, conduct the inspection for no fee (Progress Inspection). These inspections are limited in scope and typically only document progress is being made.
- B. Additional fee. In addition to the basic inspection fee, the following fees shall be charged:

1. Residential inspections:

a.	Apartments with 3 – 6 units	\$15.00
b.	Apartments with 7 – 20 units	30.00
c.	Apartments with more than 20 units	60.00
d.	Hotels/motels with less than 20 units	30.00
e.	Hotels/motels with 20 – 99 units	50.00
f.	Hotels/motels with more than 99 units	100.00
g.	Dormitories with less than 20 units	15.00
h.	Dormitories with 20 – 99 units	25.00
i.	Dormitories with more than 99 units	35.00

2. Non-residential inspections, including business license inspections under <u>Section 10.10.020</u>, inspections under 10.10.050, and child care facility inspections:

a.	1,000 – 1,999 sq. ft.	\$25.00
b.	2,000 – 4,999	35.00
c.	5,000 – 9,999	50.00
d.	10,000 – 19,999	75.00
e.	20,000 - 49,999	100.00
f.	50,000 – 99,999	125.00
g.	Over 99,999	150.00

D. Re-inspection fees. Where re-inspections are required to confirm compliance with requests or orders to correct, and all violations have been corrected, an inspection fee of \$50.00 per hour shall apply. Where reinspections occur and violations have not been corrected, the following fees apply:

1.	First re-inspection	\$100.00
2.	Second re-inspection	200.00
3.	Third and subsequent re-inspections	400.00

4. In addition to the fees in subsections  $\underline{D}.1. - \underline{D}.3.$ , a fee of \$10.00 shall be assessed for each common hazard violation noted in the

original inspection, but not corrected at the time of re-inspection. Common hazards, with reference to the corresponding 1997 Uniform Fire Code section, are:

- G. Hourly rate for fire and EMS personnel and equipment at special events.
  - 1. When fire or emergency medical personnel and/or equipment are required at special events, the event coordinator shall be charged at the rate of \$110.00 per hour, per person, for non-municipal functions, including but not limited to:
    - a. Emergency medical support standby;
    - b. Engine company standby at fireworks displays; and
    - c. Activities occurring under municipal permit in municipal right-of-way.
  - 2. Requests for fire and EMS personnel and equipment at any of the types of functions described above shall provide prior written notice as follows:
    - a. Written requests received more than ten days in advance of the function shall be charged a two-hour minimum for each person, even if the function is less than two hours in length; or
    - b. Written requests received ten days or less prior to the function shall be charged a four-hour minimum for each person, even if the function is less than four hours in length.
  - 3. The number of personnel required shall be in the sole discretion of the Fire Chief, based upon:
    - a. The type of event; and
    - b. The size of the event, including:
      - i. The number of participants;
      - ii. Whether or not alcohol is to be served;
      - Whether or not the organization holding the event is a non-profit or a for-profit entity;
      - iv. Complexity of the event;
      - v. Adequacy of insurance coverage confirmed by the municipal Risk Manager;
      - vi. The provision of private or volunteer security personnel; and
      - vii. Any other circumstances potentially compromising the safety, health, and welfare of the participants and municipal citizens.

It also allows the Fire Chief to cover admistrative costs associated with review of fire systems reports where deficiencies are found, and standby personnel and apparatus costs for special events, and charge daycare operators a lower fee based on the limited inspection effort necessary for those occupancies.

FROM: **MAYOR** 1 2 3 **SUBJECT:** AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE 4 SECTION 10.75.010 TO REDUCE THE FEE FOR PROGRESS 5 INSPECTIONS AND TO ADD FEES FOR SPECIAL OCCUPANCY 6 INSPECTONS, FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEMS REPORT REVIEW, 7 AND STANDBY FIRE SERVICE OPERATIONS. 8 9 It is necessary to document progress towards completion of deficiencies identified in buildings and systems using fire inspection notices (FIN's). Currently, there is no 10 provision in code to allow inspectors to make site inspections verifying progress, and no 11 charge for associated inspection fees, as outlined in title 10.75 – Fees for Fire Inspections. 12 This ordinance incorporates these fees into the Anchorage Municipal Code. 13 14 15 Home daycares are now inspected by the Anchorage Fire Department, Fire Prevention 16 Division. The inspection of these facilities, with the most vulnerable of populations, is critical but is not easily categorized in code, since services are provide in private homes; 17 and, typically, private homes are not subject to inspection. This ordinance codifies a 18 reduced fee, recognizing the limited area of inspection for home daycare occupancies, as 19 well as the lower associated documentation and follow up required. 20 21 22 Lastly, building owners and operators are required under State law to have fire suppression and notification systems inspected annually to verify compliance and operability. When 23 those reports recognize necessary corrections potentially rendering the systems inoperative 24 or diminished, the systems contractor is required to provide reports to the local Fire 25 Marshal's office.
