AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND RE-ENACTING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 4.90 TO ESTABLISH THE WATERSHED & NATURAL RESOURCES ADVISORY COMMISSION.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 4.90, Aquatic Resource Commission, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

<u>Section 2.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 4.90 is hereby re-enacted and renamed the Watershed and Natural Resources Advisory Commission to read as follows:

Chapter 4.90 Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission

4.90.010 Purpose & Goal.

4.90.020 Composition of Commission.

4.90.030 Powers & Duties.

4.90.010 **Purpose & Goal.**

- A. There is established a Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission.
- B. The Commission serves as a technical liaison between municipal departments, the community and state and federal agencies having water quality, watershed and natural resources management responsibilities, programs to restore and improve fish and wildlife habitat and other activities to increase community stewardship of aquatic and other natural resources within the Municipality of Anchorage.
- C. The goal of the commission is to sustain the economic and community benefits of healthy creeks, watersheds and natural resource lands within the Municipality of Anchorage by providing technical advice and guidance to help facilitate coordinated and collaborative local, state, federal and private sector watershed and natural resources stewardship, restoration and protection actions.

4.90.020 Composition of Commission.

- A. The Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission shall be composed of nine members.
- B. When making commission appointments, due consideration shall be given to technical qualifications in the fields of aquatic resources, creek restoration, fish passage, hydrology, land management, engineering, project management and permitting, watershed management, education/outreach and fish and wildlife.
- C. The director of the municipal Planning department, or designee, shall serve as the secretary to the commission. Other municipal departments may provide staff support to the commission for issues pertinent to individual departments.

4.90.030 **Powers & Duties.**

- A. The commission has the following powers and duties:
 - 1. Make recommendations, provide advice, and submit reports to the Assembly, the mayor, and municipal departments on watershed, creek and natural resource stewardship, restoration, and protection matters.
 - 2. Serve as a technical liaison and a point of contact between the Municipality and state and federal natural resource, fish and wildlife management agencies, and other interests involved in the stewardship, restoration, management and protection of aquatic habitat, watersheds and natural resource.
 - 3. Review and make recommendations for such special studies on watershed, creek and natural resource matters as may be requested or designated by municipal departments or boards, commissions, or the Assembly.
 - 4. Act in a technical advisory capacity to the Parks and Recreation Commission, Heritage Land Bank Advisory Commission, community councils and other municipal boards and commissions on matters related to creeks, watersheds, and natural resource lands.
 - 5. Provide recommendations to the Mayor and the Assembly on annual capital improvement plans and budgets for natural resource, creek restoration and watershed related activities and projects.

- Function as the permanent advisory entity for the Municipality's 6. Sustainable Salmon Program and National Fish Habitat Partnership activities.
- 7. Assist with public outreach and education on topics and issues of interest to the commission.
- Provide technical advice, as requested, to the Anchorage School 8. District on curricula and other school programs addressing watersheds, stream ecology, wildlife management and creek restoration.
- Perform other duties, as requested the Mayor and the Assembly. 9.
- Prepare an annual report of commission activities. 10.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and Section 3. approval by the Assembly.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND RE-ENACTING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 4.90 TO ESTABLISH THE WATERSHED & NATURAL RESOURCES ADVISORY

COMMISSION.

This ordinance repeals Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 4.90, Aquatic Resource Commission, and re-enacts chapter 4.90 to establish the Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission.

Creeks, natural resources lands and watersheds within the Municipality of Anchorage provide tremendous economic and other valuable benefits to the community, including recreation and tourism, stormwater management, habitat for fish and wildlife, and educational venues for Anchorage school, resource agencies and various municipal departments.

Most watershed and natural resource policy and program issues cut across private and public sector jurisdictions and resolution of these issues is not the sole responsibility of any one local, state, and federal government entity. By establishing a Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission, the Municipality of Anchorage can obtain sound technical advice and guidance in order to proactively and collaboratively address multi-jurisdictional watershed and natural resource issues.

A Municipal Watershed Task Force (Task Force) was created in 2005 to provide the Municipality with technical guidance and expertise on watershed management, salmon and creek restoration. The Task Force has provided technical expertise to the Municipality of Anchorage at no cost to local residents, assisted municipal departments with project permitting involving creeks, watersheds and wetlands, contributed resources to local restoration projects, improved relations between the Municipality and state and federal resource agencies, and provided a forum for community councils and the public to raise and proactively address watershed related issues which cut across multiple local, state, and federal jurisdictions.

However, the Task Force is a temporary entity and is not formally designated within municipal code. The Aquatic Resource Commission, established in 1991 in Anchorage Municipal Code, does not meet current needs and it sunset in 1994. Establishing a formal Watershed & Natural Resources Advisory Commission helps sustain the benefits provided by the Task Force and the intent of the Aquatic Resource Commission.

The commission will advise the Administration and the Assembly on technical matters

related to local watersheds, habitats, fish and wildlife, and natural resource issues, helping to address Municipal needs and requirements outlined in Anchorage 2020, the Living with Wildlife Plan, MOA's sustainable salmon program, the Anchorage Bowl Parks Plan, and aspects of Anchorage's NPDES Permit requirements. The commission also provides a mechanism to help the Municipality secure state, federal, and private sector funds for watershed restoration and stewardship projects.

THE ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND RE-ENACTING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 4.90 TO ESTABLISH THE WATERSHED & NATURAL RESOURCES ADVISORY COMMISSION.
