ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2008-100

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 3.87.020, 3.87.050, 3.87.060 AND 3.87.070, TO PROVIDE A RETIREE MEDICAL FUNDING PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Anchorage Municipal Code section 3.87.020 is amended to add 2 new definitions to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

Definitions. 3.87.0<u>20</u>

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

High Deductible Health Plan has the meaning assigned by Section 223, Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The Municipality will set annual deductibles for its high deductible health plan to coincide with IRS minimum deductibles, once IRS minimum deductibles rise to current municipal deductibles, and thereafter.

*** Presumed Disability means certain diseases known to occur with greater frequency among fire fighters than among the general population. For purposes of determining a member's status for section 3.87.050A.1., the Municipality will consider members with presumed disabilities, as determined under AS 23.30, to be Class 1 members for the purpose of calculating the monthly discount described in 3.87.050 A.1.

<u>Section 2.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 3.87.050, Eligibility for Active Municipal Police or Fire Health Insurance Plan, is amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

3.87.050 Eligibility for active municipal police or fire health insurance plan.

- Within 31 days of appointment to retirement, a member may elect to continue participation in the active police or fire health insurance Α. plan. If a member elects to continue participation at such time, proof of insurability shall not be required and preexisting condition clauses shall not apply. The required active insurance premium for such coverage must be paid from the member's HRA account as a qualified payment. To the extent that the amount credited to the member's premium account is not sufficient to pay the full required active insurance premium, the member shall be required to contribute the balance of the required active insurance premium to the active municipal police or fire health insurance plan. This may be by voluntarily electing to take the payment from the member's retirement benefit from the police and fire retirement system, or other forms of payment deemed acceptable by the Municipality of Anchorage, including but not limited to the authorized deduction from the member's spouse that is also a member of the program.
 - 1. The Municipality shall provide a monthly discount from the stated premium to all members purchasing municipal health insurance. This monthly discount will be equal to the high deductible health plan monthly premium minus the monthly Class 1 contribution.
 - a. Members who purchase municipal health insurance are not restricted to the high deductible health plan. The member may elect another eligible health plan and still receive the benefit of the monthly discount.
 - 2 [1]. In the event that a member's permanent disability benefits are awarded retroactively, the member shall have 31 days from the date of the police and fire retirement board's decision to

grant permanent disability benefits to elect to participate in the active police or fire health insurance plan without being subject to proof of insurability or preexisting condition clauses. However, such participation will be effective on the first of the month following such election; coverage is not retroactive.

For the years after the first year of membership, the 4. contribution amount shall be the member's initial contribution amount adjusted annually in accordance with the CPI factors described below:

Members retired due to permanent occupational disability or reclassed as permanent occupational disability, as defined in chapter 3.85, shall be entitled to Class 1 benefits to remediate the diminution of benefits a member would have been entitled to if the member had continued in service until normal retirement age.

<u>Section 4.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 3.87.070 is amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not amended and therefore not set out):

3.87.070 Amendment and termination of the police and fire retiree medical funding program.

- A. Every five years from January 1, 1995, the assembly will review the operation of the program including the amount of the initial monthly contribution established in Section 3.87.060 to be made by the municipality.
 - 1. The Internal Auditor will perform an audit of the trust once every two years. The scope of the audit may include, but is not limited to evaluating administrative costs, and reviewing enrollment and payment records for members purchasing health insurance through the Municipality.
 - 2. The results of the annual internal audit procedures shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees and Municipal Assembly for review.

SUBJECT: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 3.87.020, 3.87.050, 3.87.060 AND 3.87.070, TO PROVIDE FOR A RETIREE MEDICAL FUNDING PROGRAM FOR

CERTAIN POLICE OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS

This ordinance is presented to the Anchorage Assembly to partially remediate the funding deficiencies incurred by certain Police Officers and Fire Fighters receiving medical insurance funding pursuant to the retiree medical funding program for police officers and fire fighters contained in Anchorage Municipal Code chapter The ordinance amends Anchorage Municipal Code sections 3.87.020, 3.87.050, 3.87.060, and 3.87.070 by adding provisions for:

- A monthly discount for members who purchase health insurance through Though the discount is set as the 1. the Municipality of Anchorage. Municipality's high deductible health plan premium less the monthly Class 1 contribution, the discount is available to all members who purchase health insurance through the Municipality of Anchorage, irrespective of the eligible plan the member elects and irrespective of the member's assigned Class.
- An adjustment to the benefit received by members receiving a permanent For the purposes of the medical 2. occupational disability retirement. insurance funding, pursuant to the retiree medical funding program for police officers and fire fighters contained in chapter 3.87, members receiving a permanent occupational disability are treated as Class 1 members.
- An adjustment to the benefit received by members deemed to have suffered a presumed disability. Presumed disabilities represent certain 3. diseases known to occur with greater frequency among firefighters than among the general population. For the purposes of the medical insurance funding, pursuant to the retiree medical funding program for police officers and fire fighters contained in chapter 3.87, members who are determined under Alaska Statutes Chapter 23.30 to possess a presumed disability, and

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who purchase health insurance through the Municipality of Anchorage, are treated as Class 1 members for the purpose of calculating the monthly discount described in section 3.87.050A.1.

This ordinance also adds a new subsection 3.87.050A.1., providing for the Municipality of Anchorage to give a monthly discount from the stated monthly premium to all members purchasing Municipality of Anchorage health insurance. This monthly discount is equal to the monthly high deductible health plan premium minus the monthly Class 1 contribution. The effect of this amendment is consistent with all federal, state, and Internal Revenue Code requirements. Passage of this ordinance is in lieu of the previously introduced series of ordinances.

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On August 12, 2008 this proposal was presented to the Anchorage Police Fire and Retiree Medical Trust Board who passed a resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, supporting the Assembly's adoption of this ordinance.
