A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY DESIGNATING JANUARY 21, 2008, AS MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY OF SERVICE.

For reading:

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the King Holiday & Service Act in 1994 and expanded the mission of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday as a national day of community service, interracial cooperation, and youth anti-violence initiatives; and

WHEREAS, to honor Dr. King in 2008, the Corporation for National & Community Service, in partnership with the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change, Inc. will celebrate the 22nd anniversary of the holiday with its national MLK Day of Service on Monday, January 21. The MLK Day of Service encourages people from all walks of life to utilize their day off from work or school to meet the growing needs of communities throughout America; and

WHEREAS, the objective of the MLK Day of Service is to bring people together who may not meet under normal circumstances; to find ways to break through barriers that have divided us in the past, in order to achieve common goals including non-violence, equality, and understanding, and to recruit year-round volunteers for ongoing community projects; and

WHEREAS, participation in the MLK Day of Service has grown tremendously and hundreds of thousands of volunteers from across the country have taken part in service projects such as tutoring and mentoring, preparing and delivering meals, building and repairing homes, schools and senior centers, as well as teaching and reflecting on the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, the goal is to have all Americans observe the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday as "a day ON, not a day OFF". The late Coretta Scott King said of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service: "The greatest birthday gift my husband could receive is if people of all racial and ethnic backgrounds celebrated the holiday by performing individual acts of kindness through service to others"; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage will conduct its 8th MLK Day of Service Project on January 21 from 12:00 noon - 4:00 p.m. at the Spenard Community Center with an innovative youth mentoring project - 50 BIKES / 50 KIDS / 50 TEAMS OF MENTORS.
