1 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE  
2 CHAPTER 14.60 TO UPDATE REFERENCES, FINES, AND PROVIDE  
3 CONSISTENCY; AMEND SECTION 8.20.030 TO CLARIFY FINES FOR  
4 SEPARATE OFFENSES; AMEND SECTION 8.75.065 C. TO CORRECT A  
5 CODE REFERENCE; AMEND SECTION 8.75.090 TO CONFER  
6 JURISDICTION ON THE ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER (AHO);  
7 AMEND SECTIONS 9.20.085 AND 15.20.100 F. TO REMOVE AHO  
8 JURISDICTION REFERENCES; AMEND SECTION 25.70.050 A. TO UPDATE  
9 THE MAXIMUM FINE; AND AMEND SECTION 26.10.070 FOR CONSISTENCY  
10 WITH PREVIOUS AMENDMENTS.

12  
13 **WHEREAS**, the Anchorage Assembly established an administrative enforcement  
14 process with enactment of Title 14 of the Anchorage Municipal Code in 1993 upon  
15 passage of AO 93-167(S-1); and

16  
17 **WHEREAS**, the references to the code sections listed in the fine schedule at  
18 Anchorage Municipal Code section 14.60.030 are not always updated at the time  
19 referenced sections are amended, repealed, renumbered, or otherwise changed;  
20 and

21  
22 **WHEREAS**, the inconsistencies accumulated over the years in the fine schedule  
23 create the potential for confusion and possible dismissal of matters by the  
24 Administrative Hearing Officer for lack of jurisdiction; now, therefore,

26 **THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:**

27  
28 **Section 1.** Anchorage Municipal Code section 14.60.020D. is amended to read  
29 as follows (*the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out*):

31 **14.60.020 Application of fine schedule.**

34 D. Notwithstanding subsection A. of this section, a minor upon whom a  
35 civil fine or a civil penalty for violation of Section 8.75.060 (Minors--  
36 Curfew) or Section 8.75.080 [8.05.451] (Minors--Possession of  
37 tobacco products) has been imposed may elect to satisfy a  
38 maximum of \$150.00 of such fine or penalty by performing  
39 community work service as assigned by the municipality's  
40 department of cultural and recreational services. To satisfy any civil

fine or penalty imposed, performance of the community work service must occur (a) within 60 days from the effective date of the final order; or (b) if the minor chooses to begin the community work service prior to issuance of a final order, within 60 days of reporting for community work service.

1. Any citation for a violation of Section 8.75.060 or of Section 8.75.080 [8.05.451] shall include information advising how a minor may elect to perform community work service in accordance with this subsection.

Prior to any citation being issued to a person for a violation of this subsection, such person shall be afforded an opportunity by the enforcement officer to dispel any alarm or immediate concern which could otherwise be warranted by requesting such person to identify himself and explain his presence and conduct.

E. *Parental civil liability.* Any act in violation of subsection [B. OR] C. or D. of this section committed by a minor under the age of 18 years shall be imputed to that minor's parent or legal guardian. A parent or legal guardian of a minor who violates subsection [B. On December 14, 1993, the Assembly created Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) title 14, Administrative Enforcement, with AO 93-167(S-1). Due to various revisions in the AMC over the past fifteen years since enactment, the administrative fine schedule in section 14.60.030 is no longer accurate. This ordinance resolves some inconsistencies in the fine schedule, such as deleting the fine for repealed sections, renumbering citations, changing the titles to match the referenced section, reorganizing out of sequence sections, updating fine amounts to match the referenced section, and revising fine amounts to provide a range rather than a single fixed fine amount.

This ordinance makes no significant substantive changes to the law, except to some penalty amounts. Some fine amounts increase to a maximum of \$500.00, to be consistent with state law and AO 2003-73. Some code sections provide for court imposition of a penalty in a misdemeanor or civil suit, with an alternative for the Administrative Hearing Officer to impose a different amount as a civil penalty. The fine schedule is amended to authorize the AHO to impose a penalty up to an amount equal to the court-authorized fine. This change is intended to reduce confusion by the issuing officer as to the proper amount to charge, give discretion within a range, and allow for increased fine amounts for multiple subsequent violations of the same section by the same offender. The amendments are intended to maintain the fine amounts at a level sufficient to deter the offending conduct. The ordinance is not proposed for purposes of increasing revenue, and it is speculative whether revenue from fines will increase or decrease, as the heftier fines may reduce the frequency of violations.

Sections 1 and 4 of the ordinance make corrections to references to code sections. Section 2 of the ordinance revises the fine schedule as explained above. Section 3

corrects references to code subsections and amends the fine for possession of graffiti implements. Section 5 confers jurisdiction on the AHO as an alternative remedy for selling single cigarettes or unlabeled or unpackaged tobacco products consistent with other violations in chapter 8.75. Section 6 removes references to AHO jurisdiction, as the meeting minutes reflect this as the intent of floor amendments to AO 95-117. Section 7 removes authorization for the AHO to impose penalties for violations of section 15.20.100 because those penalties were not listed in the fine schedule, are misdemeanor level penalties, and an AHO may not be authorized to impose forfeiture and the high penalty amount. Section 8 increases the maximum fine amount for title 25 violations to \$500.00, to be consistent with state law maximum fines for violations, and with AO 2003-73. Section 9 amends fine amounts for violations of title 26 to be consistent with previous amendments to fines for violating specific provisions listed in the fine schedule.

Each department charged with enforcing specific sections where a fine is increased has reviewed, commented, and approved the amendments made by this ordinance.
