A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AND MAYOR DAN SULLIVAN TO WELCOME DELEGATES TO THE 44<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL ALASKA FEDERATION OF NATIVES CONVENTION OCTOBER 22-24, 2009 AND TO THE FIRST ALASKANS INSTITUTE'S OF ELDERS AND YOUTH CONFERENCE OCTOBER 19-20 AT THE DENA'INA CONVENTION CENTER.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage is honored to host the 2009 Alaska Federation of Natives Convention scheduled for October 22-24 at the Dena'ina Convention Center and extends the warmest hospitality to delegates from across Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the 44<sup>th</sup> AFN Convention theme is "Northern Dreams—Our Historic Journey Continues;" and

WHEREAS, First Alaskans Institute's Elders & Youth Conference "Generations of Wisdom, Generations of Strength" is scheduled October 19-20 preceding the AFN Convention, bringing together more than 1000 Elders and Youth from rural and urban Alaska to network and discuss important issues to encourage the maintaining of traditional Native values and practices while thriving in the modern world; and
