**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY HONORING AND  
REMEMBERING CORPORAL GREGORY M. W. FLEURY**

WHEREAS, Gregory M.W. Fleury, 23 years of age, lived in Alaska, residing in Anchorage,  
and graduated from Robert Service High School in 2005; and

WHEREAS, Corporal Fleury served in the United States Marines as a helicopter crew chief on  
the UH-1, and was assigned to a light attack helicopter squadron based out of Camp Pendleton,  
California; and

WHEREAS, Cpl. Fleury served two tours in Iraq, and was in the midst of serving a tour in  
Afghanistan; and

WHEREAS, Cpl. Fleury bravely served his country with a sincere desire to preserve and  
defend the freedom and liberty of all Americans; and

WHEREAS, all Americans owe Cpl. Fleury a debt of gratitude that can never be repaid; and

WHEREAS, Cpl. Fleury put his country's needs above his own, and sacrificed his life so that  
all may live in freedom;


WHEREAS, Cpl. Fleury was awarded several military awards, including the Marine Corps  
Good Conduct Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, and the Global  
War on Terrorism Service Medal.

WHEREAS, Cpl. Fleury is the first Marine Corps Alaska Native to be killed in action with  
serving in either Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring Freedom;


NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves that:

Corporal Gregory M.W Fleury is honored and remembered for his commitment, dedication, and  
ultimate sacrifice to  
the state of Alaska and the Municipality of Anchorage.
