AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 16 TO ENACT A NEW CHAPTER REGARDING THE COLD WEATHER PLAN FOR HOMELESS PERSONS.

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THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

The Anchorage Municipal Code title 16 is hereby amended to add a new Section 1. chapter 16.120 to read as follows:

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COLD WEATHER PLAN FOR HOMELESS Chapter 16.120 PERSONS.

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Plan purpose and objective. 16.120.010

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The Cold Weather Plan for Homeless Persons implements measures to A. coordinate public and private resources when outside temperatures pose an immediate danger to the life and health of unsheltered people within the municipality. The plan objective is to safeguard the lives of vulnerable homeless individuals by providing shelter during inclement weather conditions.

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The department shall take reasonable and necessary actions to implement the B. requirements of this chapter.

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Cold weather plan activation and deactivation. 16.120.020

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The Cold Weather Plan shall be activated when the outside temperature drops A. to 32 [15] degrees Fahrenheit or below, by ambient or wind-chill measures. The plan is automatically in effect, with no further action required by the municipality or by designated temporary cold weather shelters, to provide shelter services under this chapter.

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The Cold Weather Plan shall be deactivated when the outside temperature rises В. to 33 [16] degrees Fahrenheit or above. Notwithstanding deactivation due to

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temperature increases, no person sheltered overnight at a temporary cold weather shelter under this chapter shall be asked or required to leave before 8:00 a.m. without good cause.

C. Temperature readings, for the purposes in this section, shall be according to the National Weather Service (NWS), Merrill Field Airport station, Anchorage. In the event the Merrill Field Airport station is offline, temperature readings from the NWS Lake Hood, Elmendorf, or Ted Stevens International Airport stations may be utilized.

16.120.030 Cold weather plan protocols.

- A. When the Plan is in effect, and for the duration of the plan, the following provisions shall apply:
 - 1. Uses or use of structures, as defined in section 21.35.020, are permitted, notwithstanding any use prohibition in chapter 21.40:
 - a. Churches designated as temporary cold weather shelters under this chapter may provide overnight shelter to homeless families and individuals who are not under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances not prescribed to the individual.
 - b. Social service facilities designated as temporary cold weather shelters under this chapter may provide overnight shelter to homeless persons.
 - c. Inebriate reception centers shall not ask or require any person admitted after 8:00 p.m. to leave the center before 8:00 a.m. the following day without good cause, regardless of intoxication or incapacitation level. Persons may leave voluntarily if otherwise released by the center.
 - 2. Other facilities designated as cold weather shelters under this chapter may provide overnight shelter for homeless persons in accordance with the conditions and requirements established by the department.

16.120.040 Designation of temporary cold weather shelters.

- A. The department shall develop and maintain a database of approved designated temporary cold weather shelters.
- B. The department may designate social service facilities, churches, and other structures as temporary cold weather shelters. Designation is a discretionary decision of the department; nothing in this chapter shall require designation, regardless of an applicant's satisfaction of all requirements set forth herein. To

qualify, a social service facility, church, or other facility shall apply to the 1 department director or a designee and satisfy the following requirements: 2 3 1. The facilities shall be certified by the Anchorage Fire Department as 4 adequate for a cold weather shelter. 5 6 7 2. Staff shall be adequately trained as determined by the department. 8 9 3. The applicant shall submit a written plan and protocols consistent with the cold weather plan of the municipality and approved by the 10 department. The plan and protocols shall include provisions indicating 11 cooperation with other cold weather and emergency shelter providers 12 identified by the department, and point of entry protocols. 13 14 A church applicant's plan and protocols shall include 15 a. provisions limiting use of its facilities as a temporary cold 16 weather shelter to homeless families and individuals who are 17 not under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances not 18 prescribed to the individual. 19 20 21 4. The applicant shall enter a written agreement with the municipality relevant to its operations as a temporary cold weather shelter. 22 23 5. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 16 TO ENACT A NEW CHAPTER REGARDING THE COLD WEATHER PLAN FOR HOMELESS PERSONS.

August 31, 2009, Mayor Sullivan released The Mayor's Strategic Action Plan for Chronic Public Inebriates and Related Issues of Homelessness. To assist with this effort the Mayor's Homeless Leadership Team (HLT) was established. Subsequently the HLT formed into five work groups that were tasked with reviewing current programs and services within specific areas of Anchorage's Continuum of Care (COC), and making recommendations regarding improvements and additions to programs and services, as well as identifying possible funding streams.

While the focus of the Mayor's Strategic Action Plan is on those vulnerable residents of Anchorage who are chronically homeless due to substance abuse and/or mental health issues, several recommendations of the HLT and work groups also affect Anchorage's efforts to deal with the larger issues of homelessness, especially families with children.

HLT Work Group 2 recommended implementation of a cold weather plan for the Municipality of Anchorage, which would allow churches, designated by the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), or their designee, to act as temporary cold weather shelters for families and individuals who are not under the influence of intoxicants, Title 21 notwithstanding.

For much of the winter of 2009/2010, Anchorage's family shelters were at capacity with wait lists. Recognizing a need, Anchorage's Faith Based Community has expressed a desire to partner with the municipality and provider organizations to help eliminate winter wait lists for family shelters in the future.

The Cold Weather Plan for Homeless Persons (The Plan) coordinates public and private resources when outside temperatures (15 degrees Fahrenheit or below) pose an immediate danger to the life and health of unsheltered people within the Municipality of Anchorage.

DHHS will develop policies and procedures for implementation of The Plan. These policies and procedures will incorporate the requirements listed in 16.120.040 of the ordinance, as well as additional requirements deemed necessary by DHHS.
