ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO NO. 2010-61(S)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 26.70.030, USE OF MUNICIPAL COLLECTION SERVICE REQUIRED, TO PROVIDE A QUALIFIED EXEMPTION WHEN THE SERVICE LEVEL ESTABLISHED BY MUNICIPAL CODE WITHIN THE SERVICE AREA CANNOT BE ACCOMMODATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF SOLID WASTE SERVICES.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 26.70.030, Use of municipal collection service required, is hereby amended to read as follows (*language indicating no amendment is included for context only*):

26.70.030 Use of municipal collection service required.

Every person residing in or occupying a building within that service area which comprises the area of the former City of Anchorage shall use the system of solid waste collection and disposal provided by the municipality. The director may exempt a person from this requirement if the director [HE] determines that the person requires solid waste collection and disposal service which cannot be provided by the municipal system.

- A. When the director determines for any reason including safety that the Department of Solid Waste Services cannot or will not provide one-operator container service, established by rate schedule in AMC 26.70.040C2, Schedule 1, as requested for a service location within the service area, and the customer presents written verification that a certified solid waste collection provider is willing and able to provide the service, the director shall conditionally exempt the property from municipal collection service under this section upon these qualifications:
 - 1. The customer's service location was in receipt of single-operator service as of January 1, 2010.
 - 2 [1]. The property continuously maintains one-operator solid waste container collection and disposal service from a certified provider.

 Upon failure to continuously maintain one-operator solid waste container collection and disposal service from a certified provider, the exemption shall expire as of the date continuous service lapses. If the lapse is without timely notice from the certified provider and the customer, failure to

continuously maintain required service shall result in permanent loss of exemption for the service location.

- 3 [2]. The service level at the location is offered within the service area, but remains unavailable from SWS. If the service level is discontinued by the certified provider, or the director reinstates the availability of municipal single-operator service to the service location, the exemption shall expire. The director shall establish the effective date of reinstatement of municipal service and fees, and provide the customer with advance written notice. Notice shall be sufficiently in advance to allow the customer to cancel service from the certified provider without incurring a cancellation fee, and the reinstatement date for municipal service shall be set to avoid an overlap in service and fees.
- 4 [3]. The director shall receive annual verification the property has continuously maintained service, and the level of service maintained.
- <u>5 [4].</u> The customer and the qualified solid waste provider agree that the director shall be notified within 30 days by the qualified solid waste provider if the service is changed or discontinued.
- 6. The director may re-evaluate the director's determination for exemption when service from a certified provider is changed or discontinued. If the conditions of exemption are no longer met, the exemption shall expire and the director shall establish the effective date for reinstatement of municipal service and fees. If the provider and the customer have provided timely notification to the director, notice shall be sufficiently in advance to allow the customer to cancel service from the certified provider without incurring a cancellation fee, and the reinstatement date for municipal shall be set to avoid an overlap in service and fees.
- 7 [5]. If the terms of the qualified exemption are not met, the exemption shall expire without the requirement of action by the director.
- 8. Unless otherwise specified in this section, the customer shall be responsible for payment of municipal solid waste collection fees effective immediately upon expiration of the exemption.
- B. Prior to granting the exemption, the director may require documentation directly from the certified solid waste collection provider, and verification that the terms of the qualified exemption will be met.

C. For purposes of this section, the term certified solid waste collection provider shall mean a person or entity holding a valid certificate from the former Alaska Public Utilities Commission or from the Regulatory Commission of Alaska, authorizing the services.

Section 2. Unless renewed or extended by ordinance prior to May 31, 2012, the provisions of subsections A-C of AMC 26.70.030 shall expire on May 31, 2012 without further action of the Assembly. This sunset provision shall be noted by the Code Revisor and tracked by the Municipal Clerk as provided in AMC 1.05.110.


<u>Section 3.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Assembly.

AO 2010-61(S) includes revisions to clarify responsibilities in meeting and maintaining the customer's qualifications for the conditional exemption. Failure to maintain the qualifying conditions will cause the exemption to expire and the customer will be responsible for payment of municipal solid waste collection fees as set out in the ordinance.

AO 2010-61(S) also establishes a sunset date of May 31, 2012, mandating Assembly review of the exemption provisions at that time.
