ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR NO. 2010–155(S)

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY OPPOSING THE AUGUST 24, 2010 ALASKA PRIMARY ELECTION BALLOT INITIATIVE ENTITLED "AN INITIATIVE CREATING AN ALASKA ANTI-CORRUPTION ACT" BECAUSE IT IS OVERBROAD IN APPLICATION AND NOT HELPFUL TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.

WHEREAS, on August 24, 2010, an initiative will be on the Alaska primary ballot that will ask voters to decide whether public funds can be used to pay dues to organizations such as the Alaska Municipal League, or to lobby the legislature on public issues important to local government; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly believes passage of this initiative is not in the best interest of the Municipality of Anchorage, and would adversely affect local and state governments in the following ways:

- Municipalities will not be able to hire lobbyists for capital projects or for help with legislation.
- Except for its elected officials, municipalities will not be able to have any
 person advocate in favor of a municipal interest unless they are specifically
 invited by a legislator, or their work fits into the undefined concept of
 "constitutional duties".
- Municipalities will not be able to undertake, promote or distribute studies, surveys, analyses, descriptions or other communications which are direct evidence as to why a piece of legislation is "bad" or "good" for residents, no matter how factual. For example, advocating for tougher criminal or DUI laws through statistical evidence would be prohibited if the distribution of that evidence to the Legislature was "specifically calculated to induce support of, or opposition to, proposed legislation".
- Unless the Alaska Municipal League ceases to "directly or indirectly influence legislative activity", the Municipality would no longer be able to be a member of the Alaska Municipal League, an organization of cities, boroughs and municipalities that provides training of elected officials, continuing education for local government employees, investment and insurance pools to maximize local resources, and acts as a center of ideas utilized by local governments to provide better, more efficient governance for their residents.

WHEREAS, passage of this initiative would significantly hamper the orderly and efficient operation of public service and government statewide; and

WHEREAS, to the detriment of all Alaskans, passage of this initiative would seriously disrupt the close working relationship between local governments and the Alaska State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, this initiative would unduly infringe upon the right of residents to communicate with their elected officials; and

WHEREAS, non-profit organizations that receive local funds, state funds or grants would find that board members and their immediate family members could no longer take part in government issues; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Municipal League (AML) has taken a strong position against this initiative in passage of AML Resolution No. 2010-8, copy attached; and

WHEREAS, the initiative goes too far and cripples the legitimate need of local governments to represent their residents' requests for capital improvements, new or modified laws, or participation in the operating budget decisions made by the state that impact the residents directly or indirectly; and

WHEREAS, the sponsors state that this initiative will "put an end to the sweetheart deals that the government contractors and special interest lobbyists love so much", but the initiative also includes the unnecessary gagging of local governments from fully and effectively representing the needs of their residents;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Anchorage Assembly, for the reasons enumerated herein, opposes the ballot initiative entitled: "An Initiative Creating an Alaska Anti-Corruption Act".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that passage and approval of this resolution is not intended as an authorization for the expenditure of municipal funds which must be specifically appropriated by ordinance.
