A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING AND REMEMBERING EAGLE RIVER'S MUSIC AMBASSADOR: ARTHUR W. BRAENDEL.

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2010, Arthur W. Braendel, founding member of the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra and the Alaska Fine Arts Academy, died at home at the age of 92, comforted by his wife of 63 years, Eleanor, and their loving family; and

WHEREAS, Arthur W. Braendel, a gifted cellist, loved string music and shared that passion through his performances with the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra for 60 years. through his years with the Borealis String Quartet, and through his teaching of many students; and

WHEREAS, born on May 25th, 1918 in Palisades Park, New Jersey, Arthur W. Braendel was a mechanical engineer with a passion for music, art, and Alaska; and

WHEREAS, following his naval service in the Pacific Theatre during World War II. Arthur W. Braendel traveled to Juneau. Alaska and in 1946 accepted a mechanical engineering position in Anchorage, Alaska with the Civil Aeronautics Administration, the territorial predecessor agency to the Federal Aviation Administration upon statehood; and

WHEREAS, in October 1946, Arthur W. Braendel married Eleanor, also a musician, and together they were among the founding members of the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra; and

WHEREAS, in 1947, Arthur W. Braendel and his family homesteaded in Eagle River where Arthur, an avid organic gardener, experimented with plants, organic fertilizers, and soil supplements; and

WHEREAS, friends and fellow musicians recall in the first 20 years of the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra, Arthur W. Braendel was the "backbone" of the orchestra, with his hand in everything - from handling advertising to ensuring that musicians had chairs; and

WHEREAS, as an engineer, Arthur W. Braendel designed and built the first sewage lagoon in Alaska, invented a lift to make the symphony chairs more cellist-friendly, and installed an hydraulic water system on the Braendel family homestead, giving the Eagle River homestead indoor plumbing two years before it had electricity; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, Arthur W. Braendel retired from the Federal Aviation Administration and after 35 years of service; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, sharing their passion for music and art, Arthur and Eleanor Braendel envisioned an academy of fine arts to encourage and to empower people to explore their gifts within; and to that end Arthur and Eleanor Braendel founded the non-profit Eagle River Fine Arts Academy, now the Alaska Fine Arts Academy; and

WHEREAS, presently and with the motto "Discover the Artist in You", the Alaska Fine Arts Academy continues its endeavors to develop the artistic skills in every individual and to provide a place to perform and display artistic talent; and

WHEREAS, over the years, the Braendels were honored with the Bear Paw Festival Lifetime Achievement Award, the Anchorage Mayor's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2004 and the Governor's Lifetime Achievement in the Arts Award in 2008; and

WHEREAS, Arthur W. Braendel performed as cellist with the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra for 60 years, retiring after the 2006 season; and

WHEREAS, still active on the Alaska Fine Arts Academy Board of Directors at the time of his death, Arthur W. Braendel served as a good leader, inspirational role model and mentor of fellow musicians and directors; and

WHEREAS, Arthur W. Braendel's leadership, talents as a cellist, and pioneering spirit are evident throughout his life and are lasting investments for his musician-filled family, his friends and the Anchorage community; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Fine Arts Academy, Arthur and Eleanor Braendel's enduring legacy, offers an inviting, nurturing and instructional environment where artists may discover and refine their talents, and share them with the community;
