AND SECOND HALF OF YEARLY PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX

PAYMENTS FOR TAX YEAR 2010

Section 29.45.240 (a) of the Alaska Statutes states in part, "The rate of levy, the date of equalization, and the date when taxes become delinquent shall be fixed by resolution." Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) 12.15.060 (A) (1) provides that "Any installment shall become delinquent on the first business day following the tax installment due date." A weekend due date will automatically be extended until the first business day following the weekend due date, per established municipal policy.

The AMC grants a seven calendar day grace period after the tax due date before any penalty is added – this requires the taxpayer to ensure receipt of payment by the Municipality no later than seven calendar days after the due date. Per established municipal policy, proof of U.S. postmark is deemed to be constructive evidence of timely payment. Tax bills are mailed to owners of record 30 days before the due date.

The Resolution submitted with this Assembly Memorandum establishes the due dates for payment of first and second installments for the 2010 personal property taxes as August 31, 2010 and October 31, 2010, respectively, and the delinquent dates as September 1, 2010 and November 1, 2010, respectively.

THE ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF THE ATTACHED ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE DUE DATES FOR PAYMENT OF FIRST AND SECOND INSTALLMENTS FOR THE 2010 PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES.
