A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY TO HONOR MR. B.J. (BARNEY) GOTTSTEIN AT THE MOUNTAIN VIEW BRANCH OF THE ANCHORAGE LIBRARY BY NAMING THE CHILDREN'S AREA AS THE GOTTSTEIN FAMILY CHILDREN'S CENTER.

WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) 3.97 governs a means of naming municipally owned buildings as well as other facilities and public places; and

WHEREAS, Mr. B.J. (Barney) Gottstein is a lifetime Alaskan, known and honored statewide for his leadership roles in business and government; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Barney Gottstein has served as President of the State Board of Education, and continues to devote time, energy, and funding to support education in Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the Mountain View community and the Anchorage Library Foundation have been working to restore the Mountain View Library since the original branch closure in 1988; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Barney Gottstein was one of the earliest supporters of the Mountain View Branch renovation, when the project was no more than a design on a piece of paper and vision for the future; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gottstein's vision was to create a dedicated space for the young people of Mountain View, so that they had a place of their own to learn and grow; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gottstein's vision included the role for the Mountain View Library branch as a neighborhood anchor and a destination to which youth of the neighborhood may make their own way, by foot or bike; and

WHEREAS, this library renovation project now serves as a centerpiece of the Mountain View Arts and Cultural District, with combined private and municipal funding of over \$4 Million, and was re-opened in September 2010; and

 WHEREAS, the early financial support from Mr. Gottstein was instrumental in launching the project and Mr. Gottstein's gift of \$320,300 is the largest gift from an individual to any of the Anchorage Library Renewal Initiative projects; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly appointed a Citizen Naming Panel, as set out in AMC 3.97, to consider naming an interior space, within the Mountain View Library, in honor of Mr. Gottstein; and

WHEREAS, after following the established policy and performing due diligence, the Citizen Naming Panel recommended that the new children's area within the Mt. View Library be named: **Gottstein Family Children's Center**.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY RESOLVES:

That the new children's area within the Mt. View Library be named the **Gottstein** Family Children's Center.



ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE

3.97.030 Procedures.

C. Final action by the assembly shall be no earlier than one year posthumously for naming of a building, facility, or park. In all naming or renaming, the assembly shall set the proposed resolution addressing the panel's recommendation for public hearing at least one month after introduction to ensure appropriate information dissemination to the public prior to final action by the assembly.
