A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY TO NAME THE 9TH AVENUE PATHWAY.

WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) 3.97 governs a means of naming municipally owned buildings as well as other facilities and public places; and

WHEREAS, as part of the new 9th Avenue Reconstruction Project, the 9th Avenue Pathway will improve accessibility and safety, and will ultimately connect Downtown Anchorage, Fairview and South Addition; greatly improving residents' ability to travel between neighborhoods and area businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly appointed a Citizen Naming Panel, as set out in AMC 3.97, to consider naming the 9th Avenue Pathway; and

WHEREAS, the 9th Avenue Pathway is a large component of the 9th Avenue Reconstruction Project's Master Plan, and an integral part of the Delaney Park Strip, which is available for all citizens to enjoy; and

WHEREAS, after following the established policy and performing due diligence, the Citizen Naming Panel voted unanimously to make two recommendations:

- 1. To recommend that the 9th Avenue Pathway be named the 9th Avenue Walkway; and
- 2. To enhance the walkway, recommends that after significant features of the Master Plan are completed that recognition be given to people who have made historical contributions to the development and betterment of Downtown Anchorage by naming in their honor designated areas or portions of the Delaney Park Strip and/or installing elements along the walkway, such as benches, which could be marked with a commemorative plaque. It is suggested that that citizen(s) apply for sponsorship for such memorials through the established Parks and Recreation naming process, which would include the cost of the element and/or plaque.

Section 1. To name the 9th Avenue Pathway the 9th Avenue Walkway; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves that:

<u>Section 2:</u> To support the Naming Panel's recommendation that after significant features of the 9th Avenue Reconstruction Project are completed, that the Walkway be enhanced by naming areas or portions of the Park Strip and/or elements in honor of people who have made historical contributions to the development and betterment of Downtown Anchorage.



3.97.030 Procedures.

C. Final action by the assembly shall be no earlier than one year posthumously for naming of a building, facility, or park. In all naming or renaming, the assembly shall set the proposed resolution addressing the panel's recommendation for public hearing at least one month after introduction to ensure appropriate information dissemination to the public prior to final action by the assembly.
