MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ORDINANCE No. 2011-14(S)

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES (POLICE) AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAÝ ASSOCIATED **OPERATIONS** AND MAINTENANCE COSTS IN THE ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE MUNICIPALITY ON APRIL 5, 2011.

WHEREAS, the best interest of the citizens and property owners in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area serving the Municipality of Anchorage, Alaska (the "Municipality") require the Municipality to acquire, improve, expand and equip a dispatch/computer room at the Anchorage Police Department Headquarters (the "Project"); and

28 WHEREAS, in order to provide financing for the acquisition, improvement, 29 expansion and equipping of such Project, it is deemed necessary and advisable 30 that the Municipality issue and sell its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$250,000 (the "Bonds"); now, therefore, 31

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

APPROVED

35 Purpose. The Assembly of the Municipality hereby determines that Section 1. 36 the best interest of the residents and property owners within the Anchorage 37 Metropolitan Police Service Area require the Municipality to acquire, improve, 38 expand and equip the Project at the time and in the order and in the manner deemed most necessary and advisable by the Municipality. The estimated cost of 39 the Project, including incidental costs and costs related to issuing and selling the 40 Bonds as provided in this ordinance, is estimated to be \$250,000.

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The Project is described in more detail in the attachment to the Assembly 43 Memorandum accompanying this ordinance. The cost of all necessary consulting 44 services, inspection and testing, administrative expenses, and costs of issuance of 45 the Bonds (hereinafter defined) and other costs incurred in connection with the 46

acquisition, improvement, expansion, and equipping of the Project shall be deemed to be costs of the approved Project.

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The Assembly shall determine the application of available moneys for the Project so as to acquire, improve, expand and equip, as nearly as may be, all of the Project described or provided for in this section.

If the Assembly shall determine that it has become impractical to acquire, improve, expand and equip any portion of the approved Project by reason of changed conditions or needs, or costs substantially in excess of those estimated, the Assembly shall not be required to accomplish such portions and shall apply Bond proceeds as set forth in this section.

14 If the Project has been acquired, improved, expanded and equipped and 15 duly provided for, or found to be impractical, the Assembly may apply Bond 16 proceeds or any portion thereof to other Municipality police service capital 17 improvements at its sole discretion. Otherwise, the Municipality shall apply such 18 remaining proceeds solely to payment of principal or interest on the Bonds, as 19 provided in the Home Rule Charter. In the event that the proceeds of sale of the 20 Bonds, plus any other monies of the Municipality legally available, are insufficient 21 to acquire, improve, expand and equip the approved Project, the Assembly shall use the available funds for paying the cost of those portions of the approved 22 23 Project deemed by the Municipality most necessary and in the best interest of the 24 Municipality. No Bond proceeds shall be used for any purpose other than a capital 25 improvement.

For the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition, improvement, expansion and equipping of the Project, which are hereby found to be a public purpose and in the public interest, the Municipality hereby proposes to issue general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) (the "Bonds").

Details of Bonds. The Bonds shall be sold in such amounts and at 33 Section 2. 34 such time or times as deemed necessary and advisable by the Assembly and as 35 permitted by law and shall mature over a period of 20 years from date of issue. 36 The Bonds shall be issued in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$250,000. The Bonds shall bear interest to be fixed at the time of sale or sales 37 The exact form, terms, conditions, contents, security, options of 38 thereof. 39 redemption, and such other matters relating to the issuance and sale of said 40 Bonds as are deemed necessary and advisable by the Assembly shall be as hereinafter determined and/or delegated by ordinance and/or resolution of the 41 42 Assembly.

The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds when due. The principal of and interest on the Bonds are to be paid first from ad valorem taxes levied and collected within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Ballot Proposition</u>. The Assembly hereby submits to the qualified electors of the Municipality the proposition of whether or not the Municipality should issue the Bonds for the purpose of financing the costs of the approved Project at the regular municipal election to be held on April 5, 2011.

The Clerk shall prepare the ballot proposition to be submitted to the voters as provided by this ordinance and the Municipal Code and shall perform all necessary steps in accordance with law to place this proposition before the voters at the regular election. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting, both in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area and areawide, on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

PROPOSITION NO.

ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA FACILITIES BONDS

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For the purpose of providing improvements to public safety facilities and related police protection capital improvements in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area as provided in Ordinance No. AO 2011-14(S), shall Anchorage borrow money and issue up to \$250,000 in principal amount of general obligation bonds with no increase in the municipal tax cap required [and increase the municipal tax cap by an annual amount not to exceed \$2,0001 to pay the associated annual operations and maintenance costs?

Voter approval of this bond proposition authorizes for 34 each \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value 35 (based on the estimated 2011 assessed valuation in 36 37 the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area): an 38 annual increase in taxes of approximately \$.06 to retire the proposed bonds ((i) an annual increase in 39 taxes of approximately \$.06 to retire the proposed 40 bonds, and (ii) an annual increase in the Municipal Tax 41 Cap (Charter 14.03(b)(2)) of approximately \$.01 to pay 42 for annual operations and maintenance-costs related to 43 the proposed capital improvements]. 44
