AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 8 TO TREAT ASSAULT CONVICTIONS UNDER MUNICIPAL CODE AS PRIOR CONVICTIONS UNDER STATE LAW.

WHEREAS, as of 2008, Alaska Statute (AS) 11.41.220 allows for prior convictions for certain assaults, including domestic violence assaults, to be counted towards elevating a new charge for another assault to a felony charge;

WHEREAS, recently a local judge has ruled that current municipal code regarding assault does not have elements similar enough to those of the state statute to allow the use of municipal convictions for assault to be used as "priors" for elevating a new charge to a felony; and

WHEREAS, allowing repeat offenders to escape felony prosecution because of this difference, especially in domestic violence situations, is a significant public safety concern:

WHEREAS, more closely mirroring AS 11.41.230, assault in the fourth degree, will allow for municipal convictions to be counted as prior convictions for purposes of felony prosecution of repeat offenders, now, therefore,
