A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, APPROVING THE CREST VIEW WATER INTERTIE AND PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF BENEFITED PROPERTIES AT TIME OF SERVICE CONNECTION.

WHEREAS, Alaska State Statute 42.05.385 mandates that when a water line extension will create, or has the potential of creating, any charge or assessment against the adjacent property, the water line extension may not be constructed unless the legislative body of each municipality through which the extension passes has approved the extension; and

WHEREAS, Alaska State Statute 42.05.385.C.3 mandates that a lien or encumbrance may not be levied against the property for the construction of the extension, unless the property owner connects to the extension; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) plans to construct a 12-inch water intertie in Crest View Lane, between First and Second Streets in Eagle River, Alaska, to improve water service delivery to existing customers; and

WHEREAS, the extension of the water line will specially benefit and provide water service to one (1) property previously not benefited, and in doing so will create potential assessments against them; and

WHEREAS, at its June 1, 2011 meeting the AWWU Authority Board supported this resolution, now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

<u>Section 1.</u> It is in the best interest of the community that said water main improvements proceed.

<u>Section 2.</u> AWWU shall keep an accurate account of all costs of the water main improvements.

 <u>Section 3.</u> After the water main improvements have been completed and the costs of the water line approved, the Mayor shall cause the computation of all applicable assessment charges.

Section 4. At such time as the property cited in the attached assessment roll connects to the water main, the respective pro-rata assessment for the water line shall be levied in accordance with Municipal Codes and the Anchorage Water Utility Tariff in effect at the time.

<u>Section 5.</u> A special assessment Collection Charge, as authorized in Rules Section 8.4 and 13.1 of the Anchorage Water Utility Tariff, in effect at the time the assessment is levied, will be charged to those properties identified in this resolution.


<u>Section 6.</u> This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, APPROVING THE CREST VIEW WATER INTERTIE AND PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF BENEFITED PROPERTIES AT TIME OF SERVICE CONNECTION

AMC 19.90 and A.S. 42.05.385 require the Assembly's approval to construct a water main extension where the extension will create any charges or assessments against the adjacent properties. A public hearing is required prior to Assembly action.

 The Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) plans to construct a 12-inch water intertie main in Crest View Lane between First and Second Streets in Eagle River, Alaska, providing an alternate water main supply to increase system redundancy and reliability. By doing so, water service will be available to one (1) parcel.

 Initially, all costs to construct the proposed water main extension shall be borne by AWWU. The total estimated cost for this project is \$285,454. When this newly benefited and previously un-assessed parcel connects to the water main, AWWU shall recover a pro-rated share of its costs through the Levy Upon Connection assessment procedures as authorized by the current Municipal Codes and Utility Tariff. Per these regulations, the total assessment amount is capped to ensure properties do not pay costs greater than that of construction through the extension of private distribution main. The total costs recoverable through levy upon connection assessments are estimated to be \$12,453.

 The properties benefiting from proposed construction, and subject to future assessments and charges, are identified on the proposed assessment roll, which is made part of the resolution carried by this memorandum. As each previously unassessed property seeks connection, the parcels' pro-rated share of assessable water main costs will be presented to the Assembly for confirmation of levy action in accordance with the rules and regulations of the AWWU Tariff in effect at the time of connection.

Owners of benefited property were notified of the estimated project cost, and their individual property's estimated cost allocation by certified mail. Property owners were invited to meet with AWWU at a time convenient for them for further information and discussion.

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The passage of this resolution will not have a fiscal impact on any Municipal owned parcels.

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The AWWU Board reviewed and endorsed this resolution at its regular meeting of June 1, 2011.
