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
10 **Section 1.** That the sum of Two Hundred Ninety Thousand One Hundred Ninety-

Subject: A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING TWO HUNDRED NINETY THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO DOLLARS (\$290,192) FROM THE STATE OF ALASKA, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES TO THE STATE DIRECT/FEDERAL PASS-THRU GRANTS FUND (231) FOR THE AIR QUALITY PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

This appropriation funds a campaign to promote measures to reduce air pollution and congestion from transportation. Advertising and education will encourage block heater use to reduce cold-start emissions. Active and alternative transportation will be encouraged through Anchorage Bike to Work and collaboration with alternative transportation community partners. The campaign will provide education to enhance the safety of bicycle commuting. The period of this grant is from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.
