7 THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:



Subject: A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING FORTY THREE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SEVEN DOLLARS (\$43,907) AS A GRANT FROM THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY TO THE FEDERAL GRANTS FUND (241) FOR THE AIR QUALITY PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

This appropriation will provide \$43,907 in funding necessary for the Air Quality Program of the Department of Health and Human Services to conduct a one-year airborne lead monitoring study at Merrill Field. Merrill Field is one of fifteen small airports in the U.S. selected by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for lead monitoring. These airports were selected because they primarily serve piston aircraft. Unlike the gasoline used in motor vehicles which no longer contains lead additives, the aviation fuel used in piston aircraft still contains small amounts of lead which is emitted into the atmosphere as part of the aircraft exhaust. The EPA has provided funding to selected State and local agencies for one-year monitoring surveys to determine whether airborne lead levels at these airports exceed the federal air quality standard. The EPA recently revised the ambient air quality standard for lead so that it is considerably more stringent.
