A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING TWO MILLION THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$2,036,635) OF REVENUE FROM THE BUREAU OF OCEAN ENERGY MANAGEMENT REGULATION AND ENFORCEMENT (BOEMRE) TO THE AREAWIDE GENERAL CIP FUND (401), IN THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND ENGINEERING DIVISION (PM&E) FOR THE CHESTER CREEK AT MULDOON ROAD REALIGNMENT AND CHANNEL RESTORATION PROJECT, PM&E NO 07-51.

WHEREAS, the subject property, generally referred to as the "Alaska Greenhouse Property", consists of 29 acres acquired by the Municipality of Anchorage in 2006; and

WHEREAS, after property acquisition, suggestions were made by the Municipal Administration that the parcels fronting Muldoon Road be sold for commercial purposes; and

WHEREAS, as a result of such use suggestions for the property, the Municipality initiated creek realignment proposals to maximize commercial use; and

WHEREAS, Chester Creek is an integral part of this property; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to 2008 and the initiation of the creek realignment process, the residents of the East Anchorage have shown a strong preference for all 29 acres of the property to be developed as an area park; and

WHEREAS, both the North East Community Council (NECC) and the Scenic Foothills Community Council (SFCC) have passed Resolutions in support of developing a 'Town Square' or 'Park Strip' style of community park at this location; and

WHEREAS, on the CIP survey returned in 2012 by the North East Community Council the council clearly rejected the projects for creek realignment and the DeBarr Road extension; and

WHEREAS, in March 2012, the Municipality of Anchorage will start a process for the creation of an Eastside District Plan which should describe the preferred use of the subject property; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for a project at the intersection of Muldoon and DeBarr Roads to improve the culvert crossing under Muldoon Road, improve drainage, fix potential flooding and icing problems, dedicate riparian corridors, improve stream habitat, and enhance overall water quality for the stream; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Section 1. To appropriate the sum of TWO MILLION THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$2,036,635) of revenue from BOEMRE to PM&E for construction of the Chester Creek at Muldoon Road Realignment and Channel Restoration Project to improve flood control and drainage through culvert and channel re-design, subject to the conditions set out in Sections 2 and 3.

Section 2. Authorization to construct the Chester Creek at Muldoon Road Realignment and Channel Restoration Project shall be contingent upon the Administration providing detail and support, and the Assembly making formal findings by subsequent Assembly Resolution based on such evidence, that:

- <u>a) The creek realignment route does not impede the development of the Alaska Greenhouse Property as a park; and </u>
- b) The creek realignment is compatible with an Eastside District Plan or a comparable Alaska Greenhouse Property Master Plan, if either Plan can be completed within the time allowance of the BOEMRE revenue.
- Section 3. If neither the Eastside District Plan nor an Alaska Greenhouse Property Master Plan is completed before the BOEMRE funding timelines expire, authorization to construct the Chester Creek at Muldoon Road Realignment and Channel Restoration Project shall be contingent upon the Assembly finding that the Administration, in advance of construction, has met and conferred cooperatively with members of the NECC Parks Committee regarding the creek realignment, and construction needs to progress timely to ensure flood control and drainage improvements through the culvert and channel re-design.

<u>Section 4 [2].</u> This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Assembly.

The Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) received a Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP) grant from the United States Department of the Interior BOEMRE to mitigate the impacts of development and creek channelization by restoring the ecological function of Chester Creek at the site of the old Alaska Greenhouse (Exhibit A).

The objectives of this project are to install a new stream crossing under Muldoon Road, restore approximately 800 linear feet of creek channel, improve drainage, fix current icing and flooding problems, dedicate riparian corridors, improve stream habitat, and enhance overall water quality protection for the stream.
