A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING THE ANCHORAGE CHAPTER OF ALASKA YOUTH FOR ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION'S EFFORTS AND SUPPORT OF THE REDUCTION OF PLASTIC BAGS THROUGH AN AWARENESS CAMPAIGN OF A "WEEK WITHOUT PLASTICS".

WHEREAS, the U.S. consumes up to 100 billion plastic bags annually, and only one to three percent are recycled; and,

WHEREAS, U.S. retailers pay \$4 billion annually for plastic grocery bags, and that cost is passed on to consumers; and,

WHEREAS, instead of decomposing, plastic bags leach toxic particles into soil and water; and,

WHEREAS, the Great Pacific Garbage Patch has been estimated at over 270,000 square miles of plastics and other non-decomposable material, harming our oceans and critical habitat for Alaska's fish and wildlife; and,

WHEREAS, the use of reusable grocery bags is one way to promote a healthy and sustainable lifestyle in the community; and,

WHEREAS, plastic grocery bags that do not end up in landfills litter Anchorage's landscape, and reducing the number of bags used would make Anchorage more beautiful; and,

WHEREAS, the reusable grocery bags are more durable and offer a simple alternative solution to the growing number of plastic bags that end up in the environment; and,

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Chapter of Alaska Youth for Environmental Action has worked diligently with local businesses that have agreed to promote the use of reusable grocery bags.
