A RESOLUTION HONORING THOMAS W. KNOX FOR HIS 25 YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE.

WHEREAS, Tom Knox has diligently worked to serve the public in the capacity of Municipal Surveyor for the Municipality of Anchorage beginning in October 1986; and

WHEREAS, as a licensed Professional Land Surveyor, Tom has always worked to improve and advance the quality of surveying in Anchorage for the benefit of the citizens of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, as a certified Senior Right-of-way Agent, Tom has maintained the highest standards in acquiring fair and equitable property rights for the citizens of Anchorage as well as the property owners affected by Municipal projects; and

WHEREAS, Tom has managed the acquisition of property rights for Municipal street and drainage projects, frequently exceeding 40 projects, and 400 to nearly 600 parcels acquired annually, including such major federally-funded projects as 15th Avenue, Arctic Boulevard, Eagle River's Business Boulevard, and the recent Lake Otis Parkway and Tudor Road intersection upgrade; and

WHEREAS, Tom's pursuit of excellence led him to advance the quality of surveys in Anchorage through continuing work to update and maintain records for a municipal-wide survey network, the Municipal Bench Mark book, and establish a GPS controlnetwork; and

WHEREAS, Tom's participation at the professional level contributed to both the Standards of Practice published and maintained by the Alaska Society of Professional Land Surveyors, development and accreditation of the University of Alaska, Anchorage's Geomatics (surveying and mapping) curriculum, as well as teaching survey courses in the program; and

WHEREAS, Tom has contributed immeasurably to our community through his many years' volunteer-coaching for the Boys and Girls Club soccer teams; and

WHEREAS, Tom's tenacity and problem solving abilities led him to assist in initiating legislation in Juneau that allowed the Municipality to re-plat two large subdivisions in the Rabbit Creek area, and then provided the oversight for the lengthy, 10-plus year replatting process that corrected numerous survey-related problems resulting in the resolution of many land title problems therein; and
