A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) OF FEDERAL SEIZED AND FORFEITED MONIES TO THE FEDERAL/STATE FINE AND FORFEITURE FUND (257) FOR USE BY THE ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Section 1. ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) of Federal Seized and Forfeited Monies is appropriated to the Federal/State Fine and Forfeiture Fund (257) for use by the Anchorage Police Department for overtime costs associated with Federal Task Force operations and assignments.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Municipal Assembly.

Subject: A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) OF FEDERAL SEIZED AND FORFEITED MONIES TO THE FEDERAL/STATE FINE AND FORFEITURE FUND (257) FOR USE BY THE ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

The Anchorage Police Department requests appropriation of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) to the Federal/State Fine and Forfeiture Fund (257). This sum is from seized and forfeited monies awarded to the Anchorage Police Department by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) through state and federal judicial proceedings resulting from joint DEA and Anchorage Police narcotics interdiction operations.

The United States Attorney General (Attorney General) is authorized under asset forfeiture provisions of the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984, the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986, Title 21 of the United States Code, and the Tariff Act of 1930 to transfer forfeited property to local law enforcement agencies participating directly in the seizure or forfeiture. The Attorney General exercises authority over the official retention and transfer of forfeited property to local law enforcement and establishes the guidelines and limitations for its use.

Appropriated funds will be used for overtime costs associated with Federal Task Force operations and assignments.
