A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING AND HONORING THE EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF WILLIAM J. SHEFFIELD.

WHEREAS, former Governor and Port Director William "Bill" Sheffield began his career in Alaska in 1953 working as a salesman for Sears Roebuck eventually becoming the top salesman in the nation for three consecutive years; and

WHEREAS, in 1958, Governor Sheffield opened his first hotel, the Anchorage Inn, the beginning of what would later become a chain of 19 hotels across Alaska and the Yukon Territory, employing more than 750 people; and

WHEREAS, with his business success, Governor Sheffield was actively involved in various community organizations serving as President of the Alaska Visitors Association in 1968 and President of the Alaska State Chamber of Commerce in 1976; and

WHEREAS, in 1975, he was a member of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough Charter Commission, which successfully developed the charter merging the Greater Anchorage Area Borough and the City of Anchorage, into what is now the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, he was elected fifth Governor of Alaska in 1982; and

WHEREAS, his term included many different accomplishments and challenges including a drastic cut in the State budget following a sharp decline in oil prices, the purchase of the Alaska Railroad; leading the way in opening the Red Dog Mine and a variety of additional transportation and infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, many of the transportation projects completed during his term continue to serve Anchorage residents today; including the expansion of Minnesota Drive, the construction of 100th Avenue, the extension of Dimond Boulevard, and construction of the A/C couplet; and

WHEREAS, his experience in Federal issues was recognized by President Clinton, who appointed him as Chair of the Federal Salary Council in 1994; and

WHEREAS, Governor Sheffield continued to pursue his commitment, passion and knowledge of the transportation industry and was appointed Chairman of the Alaska Railroad Corporation Board of Directors in 1995 becoming CEO/President of the Railroad two years later; and

 large, the Alaska Railroad Depot at the Ted Stevens International Airport was named after him in 1999; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of his dedication to the Alaska Railroad and the state at-

WHEREAS, Governor Sheffield came out of an early retirement when he was appointed Director of the Port of Anchorage in 2001 by former Mayor George Wuerch; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as Port Director, he has worked diligently to address the ongoing challenge of deteriorated infrastructure while continuing to see an increase in tonnage, business and profits at Alaska's Port; and

WHEREAS, Governor Sheffield advocates to State and Federal leaders, along with Alaskan residents, of the critical importance of infrastructure investments as a path for economic growth and security; and

WHEREAS, he continues to use his experience to provide leadership and perspective for many Anchorage-based organizations and is a board member of the Alaska Railroad Corporation, ENSTAR, Alaska Pacific University, Charter College, and is a founding member of Commonwealth North; and

WHEREAS, Governor Sheffield is widely recognized for his generous contributions to a variety of non-profit organizations including the March of Dimes, Special Olympics Alaska, Alaska Public Radio, the Anchorage Museum at Rasmuson Center, Providence Alaska Medical Center, and Alaska Pacific University.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

That the Anchorage Municipal Assembly and Mayor Sullivan recognize Governor Sheffield's decade of service to the Municipality of Anchorage, and his many accomplishments and achievements benefiting both citizens of the State of Alaska and the Municipality of Anchorage during his 60 years of service.
