A RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF PIONEER ALASKAN FRANK M. REED AND RECOGNIZING HIS SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA

WHEREAS, Pioneer Alaskan Frank M. Reed passed away on Sunday, January 22, 2012 at age 99, following a very brief illness,

WHEREAS, the Reed family has lived in Alaska since 1900 when Frank Reed's parents met on the steamship Zoolandia headed for Nome and married 4 years later, and although he was born in Seattle in 1912, young Frank Reed moved to Anchorage in 1915 and stayed to grow up, marry his wife Maxine and raise their family,

WHEREAS, while his father was involved in civic and commercial affairs, serving on the first Anchorage City Council and starting a lumber company and an electric company, Frank and his brother helped their mother run the Anchorage Hotel, playing "bellhop, desk clerk, maid, laundryman, coal shoveler, whatever",

WHEREAS, Frank Reed graduated from Anchorage High School in 1931 and the University of Washington in 1937, returned to Anchorage to serve as Vice President of Anchorage Light and Power, President of Alaska Electric and Equipment Co., partner in the Turnagain Arms Apartments, head of the Small Business Administration in Anchorage, Senior Vice President of the Alaska Bank of Commerce and other commercial endeavors.

WHEREAS, of all the civic and humanitarian activities, including the Lions Club, Anchorage Federated Charities (which became the United Way), the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce, Chair of the Anchorage School Board, the City Council, the Planning Commission, Anchorage YMCA, the Marston Foundation, and several others, his most notable was Chairing the Anchorage Charter Commission, leading in 1975 to the unification of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough and the City of Anchorage into the Municipality of Anchorage,

WHEREAS. Frank Reed was known for his can-do attitude, his common sense, his compassion and caring, and his love of and dedication to the community of Anchorage; now, therefore,
