A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING AND HONORING THE LIFE OF JOHN JOSEPH "JACK" POWERS.

WHEREAS, Anchorage resident John Joseph "Jack" Powers, was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in 1942; and

WHEREAS, Jack Powers relocated to Alaska in 1962 with the United States Army, and was stationed at Fort Richardson before being honorably discharged in 1964; and

WHEREAS, Jack worked at the Anchorage Telephone Utility, where he moved through the ranks from an entry level apprentice to the Central Office Installation Foreman, supervising more than 20 employees during his 18-year career; and

WHEREAS; Jack was one of the founding members of the Anchorage Bucs baseball team; and

WHEREAS, Jack received numerous community awards and recognitions over the years: in 1995, he was honored as Hope Cottages "Employer of the Year" and received the respectable Melvin Jones Fellow award in 1997 from the Lions Club International Foundation; and

WHEREAS, in 2008, Jack donated \$25,000 and initiated the efforts to encourage the community to raise funds to help revive the financially devastated Anchorage Fur Rendezvous, which proved to be a turning point for this renowned organization; and

WHEREAS, Jack owned and operated Tudor Road Bingo Center, Lottery Alaska, Tudor Charity Tabs (two locations), and The Silver Derby Campground and RV Park in Lowell Point (Seward), employing more than 55 Alaskans; and

WHEREAS, through his charitable gaming efforts, Jack raised more than \$20 million for Alaska charities throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, Jack was known as a "super voter," and recognized his responsibility to vote in every election held. Over the years, he volunteered and supported numerous candidates and their campaigns; and

WHEREAS, Jack enjoyed listening to good ole' rock and roll and jazz music, and was known back in the day for his crowd-pleasing jitterbug performances; and

WHEREAS, Jack was an entrepreneur and inventor who especially enjoyed bingo
