1 **A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APPROPRIATING**  
2 **THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED**  
3 **SIXTY-ONE DOLLARS (\$193,461) FROM THE STATE OF ALASKA (SOA),**  
4 **DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES (DOTPF) TO**  
5 **THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS DIVISION**  
6 **STATE CATEGORICAL GRANTS FUND (231) AND TO AUTHORIZE THE**  
7 **TRANSFER OF RESPONSIBILITY AGREEMENT (TORA) WITH THE DOTPF FOR**  
8 **AMATS ARTERIAL ROADWAY DUST CONTROL.**  
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10  
11 **WHEREAS**, the Administration and Assembly approved AR2011-95 a grant with SOA  
12 DOTPF on May 10, 2011 in the amount of Two Hundred Thirty-two Thousand One  
13 Hundred Fifty-three Dollars (\$232,153) for AMATS arterial roadway dust control within  
14 the Municipality of Anchorage (MOA); and

16 **WHEREAS**, the Administration has reviewed and signed the SOA DOTPF TORA  
17 agreement and is asking for a BP2012 appropriation, and  
18

19 **WHEREAS**, now the SOA DOTPF has offered the BP2012 dust control measures  
20 identified within this TORA that will help reduce airborne dust on major roadways  
21 within the Municipality during peak periods; now therefore,  
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23 **THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:**

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25 **SECTION 1.** That One Hundred Ninety-three Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-one  
26 Dollars (\$193,461) is hereby appropriated as a grant from the SOA DOTPF to State  
27 Categorical Grants Fund (231) for AMATS arterial dust control.  
28

29 **SECTION 2.** That the TORA agreement is hereby authorized between the SOA  
30 DOTPF and the MOA for the purpose of dust control on major arterial roadways within  
31 the Municipality.

33 **SECTION 3.** This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval  
34 by the Assembly.

3 **SUBJECT: A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE**  
4 **APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE**  
5 **THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE DOLLARS (\$193,461)**  
6 **FROM THE STATE OF ALASKA (SOA), DEPARTMENT OF**  
7 **TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES (DOTPF) TO THE**  
8 **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS**  
9 **DIVISION STATE CATEGORICAL GRANTS FUND (231) AND TO**  
10 **AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF RESPONSIBILITY AGREEMENT**  
11 **(TORA) WITH THE DOTPF FOR AMATS ARTERIAL ROADWAY**  
12 **DUST CONTROL.**

15 The resolution appropriates the sum of \$193,461 from the SOA DOTPF under a  
16 TORA (Project No. 52748) to the Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) State Categorical  
17 Grants Fund 231 and authorizes the TORA for the purpose of AMATS Arterial  
18 Roadway Dust Control within the MOA. The 2010-2013 Transportation  
19 Improvement Program, approved November 19, 2009, included funding for dust  
20 control along major arterial roadways and may be extended to add up to two  
21 additional years of funding. The subject TORA amendment extends the  
22 performance period for one additional year through December 31, 2012 and  
23 provides additional funding in the amount of \$193,461.

25 The purpose of this TORA is to provide dust control and reduce airborne PM-10  
26 emissions during peak periods along major Anchorage roadways. MOA Street  
27 Maintenance will apply magnesium chloride along major roadways regardless of  
28 ownership to prevent dust from becoming airborne from high speed traffic.  
29 Particulate matter that is less than ten microns in size is defined as PM-10. When  
30 suspended in the air, this small particulate matter affects humans as it is inhaled,  
31 forcing the heart and lungs to work harder to provide oxygen to the body. This can  
32 lead to a decreased breathing ability and damage to the heart. The harmful effects  
33 are particularly severe in the elderly, children and persons with pre-existing  
34 respiratory problems.
